A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a financial and 2 compliance audit of the department of transportation highways division was conducted by the office of the auditor, and the 3 audit report was issued on February 3, 2022. The audit examined 4 the financial statements relating to government activities and 5 6 each major fund of the highways division for the 2020-2021 fiscal year. The legislature also finds that the highways 7 8 division has managed federal funding for projects within the 9 State, and that the audit report focused on ensuring compliance 10 with federal laws and regulations relating to such funding. 11 The legislature further finds that the audit report made 12 several findings relating to one material weakness and one 13 significant deficiency in internal control over financial 14 reporting, and two significant deficiencies in internal control

15 over compliance. While the department of transportation 16 concurred with the findings and developed corrective action



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plans, further action is needed to ensure compliance with
 federal laws and regulations.

Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to mandate the
department of transportation highways division to adopt and
implement the recommendations made by the office of the auditor.
SECTION 2. (a) The department of transportation highways
division shall implement the audit recommendations made by the
office of the auditor regarding effective authentication
requirements by December 1, 2023.

10 (b) The highways division shall:

(1) Perform a comprehensive review of its internal 11 controls in accordance with the five elements of 12 13 internal controls specified in the standards for internal control in the federal government, with an 14 emphasis on the control activities element to include 15 16 policies and procedures that require manually or electronically documented reviews and approvals of 17 18 accounting data before posting to any system or 19 . . subsystem;

20 (2) Implement effective authentication requirements for
21 the highways division's information technology systems



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1		by working with either the developer of its current
2		system, if the highways division retains its current
3		system, or a new consultant if the highways division
4		implements a new system;
5	(3)	Implement formal change management policies and
6		procedures for the highways division's financial
7		systems;
8	(4)	Train all program personnel responsible for federally
9		funded programs on the policies and guidelines
10		established by the National Highway Traffic Safety
11		Administration grants tracking system user's manual,
12		including processing and disbursing advances;
13	(5)	Train program personnel on federal requirements,
14		including Federal Funding Accountability and
15		Transparency Act of 2006, P.L. 109-282, subaward
16		reporting requirements; and
17	(6)	Direct program personnel to obtain access to the
18		Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act of
19		2006, P.L. 109-282, subaward reporting system and
20		direct program personnel to perform the necessary
21		subaward reporting.

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SECTION 3. The department of transportation shall submit a
 report of its progress regarding implementation of the
 recommendations on effective authentication requirements to the
 legislature no later than forty days prior to the convening of
 the regular session of 2024.

6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
