SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE STATE, CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU, AND UNITED STATES MILITARY TO COORDINATE AND ADDRESS THE ISSUE OF ILLEGAL DUMPING WITHIN WAIPAHU AND THE SURROUNDING COMMUNITIES OF EWA, PEARL CITY, AND AIEA ON OAHU.

WHEREAS, illegal dumping poses significant environmental 1 risks to communities, and proactive measures must be taken to 2 safequard public health and preserve the State's natural 3 4 resources; and 5 6 WHEREAS, illegal dumping has long plagued Waipahu, Oahu particularly the area along the West Lock bike path from Waipahu 7 to Aiea, where shopping carts clutter drainage ditches; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, Carroll Cox of EnviroWatch compared this eyesore to the aftermath of a bomb, emphasizing the pressing need for 11 12 action against time multiple illegal dump sites identified in Waipahu; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, illegal dumping is visible to Waipahu Elementary School, Waipahu High School, and other educational centers, 16 posing a threat to the health and well-being of students, and 17 immediate action is imperative to mitigate these risks and 18 ensure a safe learning environment for all; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, waste disposal in Waipahu and surrounding communities threatens public health, contaminating soil, water 22 sources, and roads, and urgent action is necessary to mitigate 23 risks, protect the environment, and ensure the well-being of 24 residents and visitors alike; and 25 26 WHEREAS, illegal dumping has created a hazardous 27 environment impacting Waipahu's and surrounding communities' 28 natural habitats and residents, and immediate interventions are 29 30 essential to mitigate harm, restore ecosystems, and safeguard the health and well-being of the community; and 31

1 WHEREAS, illegal dumping has diminished community pride in 2 cleanliness in Waipahu and surrounding communities, and 3 fostering awareness, education, and community involvement is 4 crucial to promote responsible waste management practices and 5 restore a sense of pride in maintaining a clean environment for 6 7 all residents; and 8 9 WHEREAS, illegal dumping in Waipahu and surrounding communities creates eyesores, health hazards, and sets a poor 10 example for future generations, and it is imperative to address 11 this issue through education enforcement, and community 12 involvement to ensure a cleaner and healthier environment for 13 14 all; now, therefore, 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 16 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 17 House of Representatives concurring, that the State, City and 18 County of Honolulu, and the United States military are urged to 19 coordinate and address the issue of illegal dumping within 20 Waipahu, Oahu and the surrounding communities of Ewa, Pearl 21 22 City, and Aiea; and 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution is intended to 24 bring awareness to the need for change to man-made, polluted 25 areas within Waipahu and surrounding communities; and 26 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Commander 29 of Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, Director of the Department of 30 31 Transportation, Director of the Department of Health, Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu, and Director of the Department 32 of Facility Maintenance of the City and County of Honolulu. 33 34 35 36 OFFERED BY:
