SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS ON SOLUTIONS TO REDUCE WILDFIRE RISK AND THE FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING A VEGETATION MANAGEMENT PROGRAM AS IT RELATES TO LANDOWNERS AND PUBLIC UTILITIES.

WHEREAS, on August 8, 2023, catastrophic wildfires swept 1 2 through various communities on Maui; and 3 WHEREAS, the wildfires impacted human life and the 4 community, housing, education, economy, and health of Maui 5 residents; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the presence of grasses, trees, and other 8 vegetation adjacent to or under electric utility lines poses a 9 10 significant risk to fire safety; and 11 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives, in response to the 12 August 2023 Maui wildfires, established six interim working 13 groups charged with evaluating specific topics related to the 14 wildfire and making recommendations for specific legislative 15 16 action; and 17 WHEREAS, the Wildfire Prevention Working Group, one of the 18 six aforementioned working groups, found that individuals are 19 the primary drivers of wildfires in Hawaii, as ninety-nine 20 percent of wildfires are caused by human ignitions; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the Wildfire Prevention Working Group also found 23 that guinea grass, fountain grass, molasses grass, and 24 buffelgrass can form continuous fuel beds, ignite easily, attain 25 extremely high fine fuel loads, and are capable of growing back 26 more vigorously in the post-fire environment than the majority 27 of native vegetation; and 28



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1 WHEREAS, utility companies in the State have miles of 2 utility lines installed throughout the State on government and 3 private land including within the public rights of way and 4 mountainous areas of the State; and 5 6 WHEREAS, a significant portion of the aforementioned public 7 and private lands are covered in unmanaged grasses, trees, and 8 other vegetation that may pose a wildfire risk; now, therefore, 9 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 11 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 12 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Land 13 14 and Natural Resources is requested to convene a working group to 15 make recommendations on solutions to reduce wildfire risk and 16 the feasibility of establishing a vegetation management program as it relates to landowners and public utilities; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 19 to study the need for policy, regulation, and guidance 20 pertaining to the management of and responsibility for 21 vegetation on public and private lands for wildfire mitigation 22 23 purposes; and 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 25 to study, evaluate, and make recommendations regarding 26 regulations that define property owner obligations to perform 27 vegetation management on public and private property for 28 wildfire mitigation purposes; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 31 to consist of the following members: 32 33 34 (1) The Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural 35 Resources, or the Chairperson's designee, who is requested to serve as the chairperson of the working 36 37 group; 38 A representative of the Senate, to be appointed by the 39 (2) President of the Senate; 40 41

(15)One member representing investor-owned electric 1 utilities, to be invited by the chairperson of the 2 3 working group; 4 (16) One member representing the telecommunications 5 6 industry, to be invited by the chairperson of the 7 working group; and 8 9 (17)A landowner that owns over one thousand acres of land, to be invited by the chairperson of the working group; 10 and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 13 to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, 14 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later 15 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 16 of 2025; and 17 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to dissolve on June 30, 2025; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 22 23 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources; Director of Transportation; 24 25 Chair of the Public Utilities Commission; Executive Director of the Division of Consumer Advocacy of the Department of Commerce 26 and Consumer Affairs; Dean of the University of Hawaii College 27 of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources; Mayors of the City 28 and County of Honolulu, County of Maui, County of Hawaii, and 29 County of Kauai; Co-Chairs of the Hawaii Invasive Species 30 Council; President of the Land Use Research Foundation; 31 President and Chief Executive Officer of Hawaiian Electric; 32 President and Chief Executive Officer of Kauai Island Utility 33 Cooperative; President of Maui Electric Company, Limited; and 34 President of Hawaii Electric Light Company, Inc. 35



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
