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## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR'S SENIOR ADVISOR FOR MENTAL HEALTH AND THE JUSTICE SYSTEM TO DEFINE THEIR ROLE AND TO PROVIDE AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE ON THE PROGRESS THE STATE HAS MADE TOWARDS JAIL DIVERSION.

WHEREAS, the Governor's Senior Advisor for Mental Health 1 and the Justice System has an undefined role; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the uniqueness and importance of having a position 4 in the Office of the Governor that is dedicated to mental health 5 and the justice system makes the Senior Advisor for Mental 6 Health and the Justice System a de facto lead on mental health 7 and the justice system initiatives for the State; and 8 9 WHEREAS, on February 5, 2024, at a joint informational 10 briefing where participants were requested to bring data in 11 support of their presentation, the Governor's Senior Advisor for 12 Mental Health and the Justice System provided the Substance 13 Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) model 14 15 on jail diversion, but provided no other data; and 16 17 WHEREAS, on February 5, 2024, the Department of Health presented that, for a one-year period, only one percent of post-18 booking jail diversion referrals were accepted; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, pursuant to Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 117, S.D. 1, H.D 1 (2007), as former co-chair of the established task 22 23 force, Governor Green recommended community-based services to avoid readmission to the Hawaii State Hospital and a community 24 secure residential program operated by CARE Hawaii, Inc. as a 25 form of jail diversion; and 26 27 WHEREAS, by letter dated February 8, 2024, and at the 28 latest informational briefing, the Chairperson of the Senate 29 Standing Committee on Health and Human Services and the 30



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Chairperson of the Senate Standing Committee on Commerce and 1 Consumer Protection requested: "As such, please provide to us 2 3 the following: 4 5 (1)A comprehensive chart, as promised in the informational hearing on February 5, presenting the 6 7 various projects and programs that fit into your 8 overall continuum; 9 10 (2) The State's capacity in each service area, by agency, 11 and the current state of those unmet needs; and 12 The Governor's plans to address that unmet need, 13 (3) including specific budgetary requirements; 14 15 16 Please include in such comprehensive chart, the jail diversion programs in the Judiciary and the triage centers financed by 17 OHHS such as that run by IHS. Please also include within the 18 19 Governor's plans, his plan to reduce the population in the 20 Hawaii State Hospital"; and 21 22 WHEREAS, on February 23, 2024, the Governor's Senior Advisor for Mental Health and the Justice System presented in 23 response to the Senators' requests the Judiciary's report, which 24 25 provided data on seven hundred and four mental assessments conducted, but otherwise provided no additional data on the 26 various community programs funded since the 2008 report to the 27 Legislature pursuant to Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 117, 28 29 S.D. 1, H.D 1 (2007) and whether any of those programs fit into 30 the SAMHSA intercept model; now, therefore, 31 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 32 33 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 34 House of Representatives concurring, that the Governor's Senior Advisor for the Mental Health and the Justice System is urged to 35 36 define their role and to provide an annual report to the Legislature on the progress the State has made towards jail 37 diversion; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor's Senior Advisor 40 41 for Mental Health and the Justice System is requested to: 42

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Gather data on the various community programs funded 1 (1)by the Department of Human Services, Department of 2 3 Health, and the Judiciary, that provide various services in the SAMHSA intercept model; 4 5 (2) Provide an annual report to the Legislature to 6 include: 7 8 9 (A) The identified programs, their capacities, and detailed reasons for the high failure rate and 10 unmet needs; 11 12 (B) Any proposed legislation; and 13 14 (C) A review of all federal and state court cases and 15 constitutional, statutory, and rule changes 16 impacting the Hawaii Revised Statutes that relate 17 to mental health and involuntary transport, 18 examination, hospitalization, and treatment, 19 including assisted community treatment, as 20 proposed in Senate Bill No. 2992, S.D. 1, H.D. 1 21 (2024); and 22 23 Submit regular reports to the Chairperson of the (3) 24 Senate Standing Committee on Health and Human Services 25 on the progress the State has made towards jail 26 diversion; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Senior Advisor for Mental 29 Health and the Justice System's annual reports to the 30 legislature are requested to be made publicly available; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 33 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and the 34 Governor's Senior Advisor for Mental Health and the Justice 35 System. 36
