## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

## REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF A TASK FORCE TO RESEARCH AND DEVELOP A GREEN HIGHWAY PROGRAM IN THE STATE.

WHEREAS, green highways have been implemented across the 1 world to promote sustainability, reduce environmental impact, 2 and enhance the quality of life for communities along highways; 3 4 and 5 WHEREAS, green highways can contribute to island heat 6 mitigation by incorporating features such as green 7 infrastructure, shade trees, and reflective pavements, which 8 help lower temperatures and combat urban heat effects; and 9 10 WHEREAS, beautification efforts along green highways 11 include landscaping with native plants, creating aesthetically 12 pleasing landscapes that enhance the visual appeal of highway 13 14 corridors, and providing habitat for local wildlife; and 15 WHEREAS, green highways offer numerous benefits, including 16 17 improved air and water quality, reduced noise pollution, enhanced biodiversity, and increased recreational opportunities 18 for residents and visitors alike; and 19 20 WHEREAS, green highways also promote sustainable 21 transportation options such as walking and biking trails, 22 electric vehicle charging stations, and public transit access, 23 reducing reliance on single-occupancy vehicles and lowering 24 25 greenhouse gas emissions; and 26 WHEREAS, the implementation of a green highway program 27 aligns with statewide goals for environmental stewardship, 28 climate resilience, and sustainable development, contributing to 29 30 a healthier and more resilient future for the State's communities; and 31



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1 WHEREAS, a new green highway stretch in Norway, known as 2 "the Green Shortcut" (Den Grønne Snarvei), has significantly 3 4 reduced journey times and environmental impact between Oslo and 5 Trondheim; and 6 WHEREAS, considering the positive impact of green highways 7 on communities worldwide, the State should take proactive steps 8 to explore and implement similar initiatives in the State; now, 9 therefore, 10 11 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 12 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 13 House of Representatives concurring, that a task force is 14 15 requested to be convened to research and develop a green highway program in the State; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of the Senate and 18 Speaker of the House of Representatives are requested to appoint 19 20 the co-chairpersons of the task force; and 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the co-chairpersons of the task 22 force are requested to select and invite the following members 23 or their designees to participate on the task force: 24 25 26 (1)A representative from the Department of Transportation; 27 28 29 (2) A representative from the Department of Land and 30 Natural Resources; 31 A representative with expertise in arboriculture; and 32 (3) 33 Any other representative with subject matter 34 (4) 35 expertise; and 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to: 38 39 (1)Develop green highway standards to address urban 40 temperatures, stormwater retention, unsightly infrastructure impacting tourism, and mental health; 41 42 and



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1 (2) Examine best practices in places that have 2 successfully implemented green highway infrastructure; 3 and 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 6 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including 7 8 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 9 10 2025; and 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 12 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of 13 14 Transportation and Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural 15 Resources.



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
