## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO STUDY THE IMPACT OF TEACHER SALARY STEP MOVEMENTS ON SALARY SCHEDULE COMPRESSION.

WHEREAS, the salary schedule for Hawaii public school 1 teachers includes steps that should reflect years of experience; 2 and 3 4 WHEREAS, teacher salary step movements play a crucial role 5 in determining the career progression of educators and their 6 compensation within the Hawaii public school system; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, teachers have not always been provided with regular step movements, with a result that some teachers having 10 decades of experience earn no more than a teacher having 11 12 significantly fewer years of experience; and 13 WHEREAS, as a result, very experienced teachers are 14 "compressed" onto the same step as teachers having significantly 15 less experience, a situation commonly described as "salary 16 schedule compression"; and 17 18 WHEREAS, salary schedule compression has been identified as 19 an issue affecting the retention and morale of educators in 20 Hawaii; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, a comprehensive study analyzing the impact of teacher salary step movements on salary schedule compression is 24 essential to making informed policy decisions and ensuring fair 25 and competitive compensation for teachers; now, therefore, 26 27 28 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 29 30 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Education is urged to conduct a thorough study on the impact of 31



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teacher salary step movements on salary schedule compression 1 within the State's public education system; and 2 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study: 5 (1) Analyze current salary structures; 6 7 8 (2) Analyze the impact of step movements on salary 9 schedule compression; and 10 Make recommendations to improve teacher retention and 11 (3) 12 satisfaction by mitigating the negative impacts of salary schedule compression through step movements; 13 14 and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is requested to collaborate with the Board of Education, Hawaii 17 State Teachers Association, Department of Human Resources 18 19 Development, and relevant stakeholders to ensure a comprehensive 20 assessment; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 23 requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 24 25 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 26 the Regular Session of 2025; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 29 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of Education, Superintendent of Education, and President 30 of the Hawaii State Teachers Association. 31 32 Dana where ( 33 34 OFFERED BY:
