SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY TO CONSIDER UTILIZING FUNDS FOR NON-CONGREGATE HOUSING FOR INFRASTRUCTURE AND DEVELOPMENT NEEDS FOR AFFORDABLE RENTAL HOUSING.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, the devastating wildfires in Maui have left thousands of residents displaced from their homes; and
5 4 5 6	WHEREAS, the ongoing chronic housing crisis on Maui created housing instability and shortages for Maui families; and
7 8 9	WHEREAS, an estimated one thousand six hundred renters have been displaced by the August 2023 Maui wildfires; and
10 11 12	WHEREAS, the majority of residents displaced have expressed a desire to live in an area geographically near to where their residences were before the wildfires; and
13 14 15	WHEREAS, federal emergency housing relief is presently providing temporary rental assistance to displaced families; and
16 17 18 19	WHEREAS, the development time for affordable rental housing is anticipated to be five to ten years; and
20 21 22	WHEREAS, displaced renters and homeowners will need short- term housing solutions beyond subsidized rentals while housing is developed or rebuilt; and
23 24 25 26	WHEREAS, meeting the need for additional affordable rental housing is critical to ensure adequate support for renters as federal aid subsides; and
27 28 29 30 31	WHEREAS, federal emergency housing relief can be utilized to create short-term rentals that can be sustained after the Federal Emergency Management Agency mission ends; now, therefore,

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1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 2 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 3 House of Representatives concurring, that the Federal Emergency 4 Management Agency is urged to consider utilizing funds for non-5 congregate housing for infrastructure and development needs for 6 affordable rental housing; and 7 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Federal Emergency Management Agency is urged to provide the State with clear 10 parameters on the authorized uses of federal financial 11 assistance; and 12 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Federal Emergency Management Agency is urged to provide a decision-making tree for 15 federal support actions; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Federal Emergency 18 Management is requested to transfer to the State post-disaster 19 20 mission any public assistance expenditures that will remain; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Federal Emergency Management Agency is urged to clarify the long-term commitment 23 24 for continued Maui wildfire disaster-related support including 25 housing for displaced residents; and 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 27 28 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Acting Director of Readiness of the Federal Emergency Management Agency. 29 30 OFFERED BY: DAVA JUDI 7 31 32
