1 2 WHEREAS, true victory is measured not by the outcome of any 3 battle, or who may prevail in any war, but rather by the enduring determination to maintain peace so these costly lessons 4 are never repeated; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, properly recognizing and honoring the lives lost 8 in World War II, particularly at the anniversary of the bombings 9 of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, will reaffirm the lessons learned from these tragedies, strengthen mutual respect and 10 understanding between our people, and reaffirm the deep 11 friendship between Japan and Hawaii for new and future 12 13 generations; now, therefore, 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 15 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 16 17 House of Representatives concurring, that the State Foundation 18 on Culture and the Arts is requested to: 19 20 (1) Begin planning to collaborate with partners in Japan 21 to appropriately recognize the eightieth anniversary 22 of the end of World War II, including the atomic bombings and lives lost in Japan and Hawaii throughout 23 the war, and reaffirm a commitment to ensuring these 24 tragedies are never repeated; and 25 26 Plan and construct a memorial or memorials, with the 27 (2) 28 intention of offering one as a gift to the people of Japan should they deem it appropriate, in a manner as 29 may be mutually agreeable to the appropriate partners 30 31 in Hawaii and Japan, to properly honor the lives lost 32 in both places, in particular innocent civilian 33 casualties of war, and reinforce that victory shall be measured not by the outcome of any battle, or who may 34 prevail in any war, but rather by the enduring 35 determination to maintain peace so these costly 36 37 lessons are never repeated; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Director 40 of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism; and Executive 41 Director of the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts. 42
