## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE STATE FOUNDATION ON CULTURE AND THE ARTS TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO RESEARCH AND DEVELOP A PLAN TO EXPAND ACCESS TO CHESS AS A COMPETITIVE SPORT.

WHEREAS, chess is a game of strategy, intellect, critical 1 2 thinking, and problem-solving, and is played regularly by over six hundred million people worldwide; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the global chess industry is estimated to be valued at more than \$2,110,000,000, and is estimated to expand 6 to \$2,600,000,000 by 2027; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, beyond entertainment, chess has been a symbol of diplomacy, fostering connections between nations, and is 10 recognized as a sport by the Olympics; and 11 12 WHEREAS, many of the strategies that are involved in chess 13 are complex mathematical algorithms that children understand and 14 decipher naturally; and 15 16 WHEREAS, chess brings out latent abilities not always 17 reached by traditional educational means by promoting logical 18 19 thinking, instilling a sense of self-confidence, and improving communication and pattern recognition skills; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, children who play chess are introduced to basic algebraic notations that increase their concentration and 23 familiarity with the subject, making them more efficient 24 learners of mathematics; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, in states where chess is offered widely in schools, students exhibit excellence in the ability to recognize 28 complex patterns and consequently excel in math and science; and 29 30

WHEREAS, considering chess as a competitive sport enables 1 schools to organize formal competitions and provide resources 2 similar to those available for traditional sports, which ensures 3 that chess teams receive the support and facilities needed to 4 compete at a high level; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, the recent success of Esports demonstrates the value of strategic thinking and problem-solving skills, 8 qualities essential in sports and in life; and 9 10 WHEREAS, people of all ages who play chess regularly have 11 been found to have increased mental health benefits arising from 12 the activity; now, therefore, 13 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 15 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 16 House of Representatives concurring, that the State Foundation 17 on Culture and the Arts is urged to convene a task force to 18 research and develop a plan to expand access to chess as a 19 competitive sport; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 22 urged to collaborate with Hawaii chess organizations to expand 23 access to chess as a learning, development, and collaboration 24 tool in public schools; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following individuals are 27 28 requested to serve as members of the task force: 29 (1)The Executive Director of the State Foundation on 30 Culture and the Arts, or the Executive Director's 31 designee, who shall serve as chairperson of the task 32 force; 33 34 (2) The Director of Business, Economic Development, and 35 Tourism, or the Director's designee; 36 37 38 (3) The Superintendent of Education, or the Superintendent's designee; 39 40
