SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO INVESTIGATE AND ENFORCE APPLICABLE LAWS AGAINST LANDLORDS WHO ARE ENDING RENTAL AGREEMENTS TO HOUSE FEMA-ELIGIBLE HOUSEHOLDS THROUGH THE DIRECT LEASE PROGRAM OR THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

1 2	WHEREAS, nearly three thousand households were displaced by the August 2023 Maui wildfires; and
3 4 5	WHEREAS, the Legislature is examining potential tools for rent control in Maui County; and
6 7 8	WHEREAS, Maui is experiencing a housing crisis due to the lack of available units; and
9 10 11 12 13 14	WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the State are utilizing short-term housing through the Direct Lease Program, Rental Assistance Program, and non-congregate shelters to house both FEMA-eligible and ineligible households; and
15 16 17 18 19	WHEREAS, FEMA's Direct Lease Program has inflated the rental market by paying three hundred sixty-six percent above- market rates to landlords who will house FEMA-eligible households; and
20 21 22 23 24	WHEREAS, the Department of Human Services Rental Assistance Program (RAP) pays above-market rates to house FEMA-ineligible households; and
25 26 27 28 29	WHEREAS, incidents have been reported on Maui where homeowners are not renewing lease agreements with existing tenants, displacing them to make room for FEMA-eligible households through the Direct Lease Program and the ineligible households supported through RAP; and





1 2 WHEREAS, these incidents have raised concerns about fairness, housing stability, and the impact on tenants who are 3 4 being displaced; and 5 WHEREAS, the Governor's emergency proclamation established 6 a moratorium on evictions in Lahaina; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the Department of the Attorney General has a duty 9 to investigate such incidents and ensure compliance with 10 relevant regulations; now, therefore, 11 12 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 13 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 14 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of the 15 Attorney General is urged to investigate and enforce applicable 16 laws against landlords who are ending rental agreements to house 17 FEMA-eligible households through the Direct Lease Program or the 18 19 Department of Human Services Rental Assistance Program; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Attorney General. 22
