SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING STATE DEPARTMENTS TO REQUIRE HOUSEHOLDS IMPACTED BY THE LAHAINA FIRES TO EXHAUST THEIR INSURANCE POLICIES BEFORE REQUESTING FINANCIAL SUPPORT FROM THE STATE.

WHEREAS, the recent August 2023 Maui wildfires have caused 1 significant devastation to Lahaina and communities in Hawaii, 2 leaving many individuals and families in need of assistance; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the State has limited resources available to 5 provide support to those affected by natural disasters, such as 6 the Lahaina wildfires; and 7 8 WHEREAS, many households impacted by the wildfires may have 9 insurance policies that could provide financial assistance to 10 cover damages and losses incurred during the wildfires, 11 12 including temporary housing assistance; and 13 WHEREAS, temporary housing through non-congregate shelters 14 15 is costing the State \$1,000,000 per day; and 16 WHEREAS, pursuant to G.M. No. 4 (2024), the Governor is 17 requesting an additional \$297,000,000 in fiscal year 2024 for 18 19 non-congregate housing and expenses for households ineligible 20 for assistance from the Federal Emergency Management Agency; and 21 WHEREAS, the State has already spent or obligated 22 \$200,000,000 through the Major Disaster Fund; and 23 24 WHEREAS, it is important for state departments to 25 prioritize the efficient use of state resources by requiring 26 households to exhaust their insurance policies before requesting 27 financial support from the State; now, therefore, 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 30 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 31 House of Representatives concurring, that state departments are 32



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1 urged to require households impacted by the August 2023 Maui wildfires to exhaust their insurance policies before requesting 2 3 financial support from the State; and 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that state departments are 5 encouraged to provide guidance and assistance to affected 6 households in navigating the insurance claims process and 7 accessing benefits available through their insurance policies; 8 9 and 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that state departments are urged to 11 prioritize the allocation of state resources to households that 12 have demonstrated a genuine need for support after exhausting 13 all available insurance coverage; and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 16 17 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor. 18 moutre 19 20 OFFERED BY:
