## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEVELOPMENT OF A BACCALAUREATE DEGREE PROGRAM IN EDUCATION WITH AN ONLINE OPTION AT LEEWARD COMMUNITY COLLEGE TO ADDRESS THE EDUCATIONAL NEEDS OF WORKING ADULTS IN ALL COUNTIES.

WHEREAS, the State recognizes the importance of providing 1 accessible pathways to education and addressing the need for 2 gualified teachers in our communities; and 3 4 WHEREAS, there is a growing demand for online educational 5 programs to accommodate working adults who aspire to become 6 teachers; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, all counties in the State face unique challenges in recruiting and retaining qualified educators to meet the 10 educational needs of their schools and communities; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, there is a need for more baccalaureate degree programs at the University of Hawaii Community Colleges to 14 expand access to educational opportunities to all Hawaii 15 counties; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, there is an urgent need for teaching programs in 19 rural areas to address current teacher shortages; and 20 WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii Leeward Community 21 College's accreditation allows the college to offer up to two 22 applied baccalaureate degree programs; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii Leeward Community College's existing Teacher Education programs are already 26 offered statewide through the Internet and include upper 27 division curriculum: and 28 29



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WHEREAS, the Hawaii State Teachers Association and the 1 Association for Advancing Quality in Educator Preparation both 2 recognize the teacher education programs at Leeward Community 3 4 College for teacher education and licensing; and 5 WHEREAS, new programs at Leeward Community College can 6 become extensions for interested students enrolled in other 7 University of Hawaii Community Colleges who are interested in 8 the teacher pathway; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the development of a baccalaureate degree program 11 in education with an online option at Leeward Community College 12 would be tailored for individuals who are employed outside of 13 the education system and seeking to enter the teaching 14 profession, currently teaching as emergency hires, and 15 substitute teaching at Department of Education public school 16 classrooms; and 17 18 WHEREAS, the Legislature passed Act 141, Session Laws of 19 Hawaii 2022, which required the University of Hawaii to 20 establish kindergarten through grade 12 expanded teaching cohort 21 programs in each county for students who are pursuing 22 undergraduate degrees in education; now, therefore, 23 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 26 27 House of Representatives concurring, that: 28 The University of Hawaii Community Colleges are urged 29 (1)to establish a baccalaureate degree program in 30 education with an online option at Leeward Community 31 College; 32 33 The University of Hawaii is urged to re-allocate funds (2) 34 35 from within the University of Hawaii Community Colleges to: 36 37 Facilitate the implementation of the (A) 38 baccalaureate degree program in education with an 39 online option; and 40 41
