SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY TO UTILIZE FUNDS FOR NON-CONGREGATE HOUSING FOR INFRASTRUCTURE AND DEVELOPMENT NEEDS FOR AFFORDABLE RENTAL HOUSING.

WHEREAS, the devastating August 2023 Maui wildfires have 1 left thousands of residents displaced from their homes; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, the housing crisis on Maui had already been creating housing instability and shortages for Maui families; 5 and 6 7 WHEREAS, those who were displaced from their homes by the 8 9 August 2023 Maui wildfires include an estimated one thousand six hundred renters; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, the majority of those displaced have expressed a 13 desire to live in an area geographically close to their 14 residences prior to the wildfires; and 15 WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) 16 housing relief aid that is currently providing temporary rental 17 assistance to eliqible displaced residents is scheduled to 18 expire in 2025; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the repopulation of the areas affected by the 21 August 2023 Maui wildfires for development of permanent 22 affordable housing to replace those that were destroyed is 23 estimated to take many years; and 24 25 WHEREAS, displaced renters and homeowners will need interim 26 housing solutions beyond subsidizing rentals in a tight Maui 27 28 rental supply market while housing is being developed or rebuilt: and 29 30 31 WHEREAS, meeting the needs for additional interim housing solutions is critical to ensure flexibility in keeping together 32

the community of Lahaina, and other communities affected by the 1 August 2023 Maui wildfires, when FEMA's rental assistance 2 expires in 2025; and 3 4 WHEREAS, constructed emergency housing relief beyond rental 5 assistance or direct leasing is imperative to keep the rental 6 market stable as federal and state assistance evolves over the 7 coming months; now, therefore, 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 10 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 11 House of Representatives concurring, that FEMA is urged to 12 13 utilize funds for non-congregate housing for infrastructure and development needs for affordable rental housing; and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that FEMA is urged to provide the 16 State with clear parameters on the allowable uses of federal 17 financial assistance; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that FEMA is urged to provide a 20 decision tree for federal support actions; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that FEMA is urged to remain open to 23 discussing disposition of transfer of assets acquired through 24 its public assistance expenditures to the State at the end of 25 its initial housing response mission; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that FEMA is urged to clarify the 28 long-term commitment for continued Maui wildfire disaster 29 30 related support including housing for displaced residents; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Regional 33 34 Administrator of Region 9 of the Federal Emergency Management Agency; Governor; and Mayor of the County of Maui. 35 36 37 38 OFFERED BY:
