SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT TO REIMBURSE HAWAII FOR DEBRIS REMOVAL, THE DREDGING OF TOXIC MATERIALS, AND OTHER ENVIRONMENTAL CLEANUP EFFORTS IN LAHAINA HARBOR.

WHEREAS, in August 2023, Lahaina, on the island of Maui, 1 2 experienced the fifth deadliest wildfire in United States history; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the wildfire deposited toxic materials, ash, and other contaminants into the waters of Lahaina Harbor; and 6 7 WHEREAS, more than two thousand two hundred structures were 8 damaged or destroyed in Lahaina and West Maui, eighty-six 9 10 percent of which were residences; and 11 12 WHEREAS, burned or melted building materials, furniture, 13 plastics, and consumer electronics produce toxic substances that have seeped into Lahaina's groundwater, and seepage and runoff 14 further threaten Lahaina's near shore waters; and 15 16 WHEREAS, a sediment analysis has confirmed the presence of 17 18 toxic chemicals and materials in Lahaina Harbor; now, therefore, 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 20 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 21 House of Representatives concurring, that the federal government 22 is urged to reimburse Hawaii for debris removal, the dredging of 23 24 toxic materials, and other environmental cleanup efforts in Lahaina Harbor; and 25 26
