SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING THE ISSUE OF ILLEGAL DUMPING WITHIN THE WAIPAHU COMMUNITY AND URGING THE STATE, CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU, AND MILITARY TO WORK TOGETHER TO ADDRESS THIS CONCERN.

1 WHEREAS, the act of illegal dumping poses significant environmental risks to the State's communities; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, illegal dumping has long plagued Waipahu, 5 particularly the West Loch bike path from Waipahu to Aiea, where shopping carts clutter drainage ditches; and 6 7 WHEREAS, Carroll Cox of EnviroWatch likened Waipahu's 8 9 illegal dumping to a bomb's aftermath, emphasizing the pressing need to clean up multiple illegal dump sites identified in 10 11 Waipahu; and 12 WHEREAS, illegal dumping is visible to Waipahu Elementary 13 School, Waipahu High School, and other educational centers, 14 posing a threat to the health, self-confidence, and well-being 15 of students and setting a poor example for future generations; 16 17 and 18 WHEREAS, illegal dumping in Waipahu and surrounding 19 communities threatens public health and the environment, 20 21 contaminating soil, water sources, and roads; and 22 WHEREAS, illegal dumping has diminished community pride for 23 cleanliness throughout the Waipahu community; and 24 25 WHEREAS, fostering awareness, education, and community 26 involvement is crucial to promote responsible waste management 27 practices and restore a sense of pride in maintaining a clean 28 29 environment for all residents; and

1 WHEREAS, urgent action is necessary to mitigate health 2 3 risks, protect the environment, and ensure the well-being of Waipahu residents and visitors; now, therefore, 4 5 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 6 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 7 House of Representatives concurring, that this body recognizes 8 the issue of illegal dumping within the Waipahu community; and 9 10 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body urges the State, City and County of Honolulu, and military to work together to address 12 this concern; and 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this measure is intended to 15 bring awareness to the need for change to man-made, polluted 16 areas within Waipahu and surrounding communities; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 19 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Commander of Joint 20 Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, Governor, Director of Transportation, 21 Director of Health, Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu, 22 and Director of the Department of Facility Maintenance of the 23 City and County of Honolulu. 24 25 26 27 OFFERED BY:
