## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE PROMPT IMPLEMENTATION OF THE HAWAII ELECTRONIC INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY ACCESSIBILITY ACT ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2024.

1 WHEREAS, Act 172, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, known as the 2 "Hawaii Electronic Information Technology Accessibility Act," 3 (Act 172), was signed into law on June 27, 2022, with the goal 4 of making all electronic information technology developed, 5 purchased, used, or provided by state entities accessible to 6 persons with disabilities; and

8 WHEREAS, Act 172 requires the Office of Enterprise 9 Technology Services, in consultation with the Disability and 10 Communication Access Board and a working group composed of 11 stakeholders, to develop and publish electronic information 12 technology accessibility standards to be implemented by all 13 state entities; and

WHEREAS, these standards are to be consistent with federal standards issued by the United States Access Board to implement section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, and the web access standards issued by the World Wide Web Consortium Web Accessibility Initiative; and

21 WHEREAS, the Chief Information Officer is required to issue 22 the Hawaii Electronic Information Technology Accessibility 23 Standards, and state entities are required to review and 24 incorporate these standards into their procurement and 25 development rules, policies, and procedures, within six months 26 of the publication of the standards or any amendments thereto; 27 and

29 WHEREAS, these requirements have been in effect since 30 Act 172 was signed into law, but the standards have not yet been 31 issued more than eighteen months later; and 32



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WHEREAS, many states already require compliance with 1 federal accessibility standards and model standards already 2 exist that can be modified if needed for use in Hawaii, making 3 further delay inexcusable to complete implementation of Act 172; 4 5 and 6 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that implementation of Act 7 8 172 is essential to ensure all residents equal access to goods, services, benefits, education, and employment opportunities 9 provided by state entities; now, therefore, 10 11 12 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 13 House of Representatives concurring, that the Chief Information 14 Officer is urged to ensure the prompt implementation of Act 172, 15 Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, on or before December 31, 2024; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Information Officer 18 is requested and advised to submit a report to the Legislature 19 no later than thirty days prior to the Regular Session of 2025, 20 describing the status of implementation of Act 172 and making 21 any recommendations for future legislation needed to ensure the 22 State's electronic information technology meets or exceeds 23 federal accessibility standards; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 26 27 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the Chief Information Officer, and the Executive Director of the 28 Disability and Communication Access Board. 29 30 31 32 OFFERED BY:
