SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REOUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO PARTNER WITH THE HAWAII STATE TEACHERS ASSOCIATION AND TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAMS AT LOCAL UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES TO PROVIDE PATHWAYS FOR SCHOOL SUPPORT PERSONNEL TO BECOME FULL-TIME TEACHERS.

1	WHEREAS, the State is suffering from a severe shortage of
2	licensed teachers; and
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4	WHEREAS, the Department of Education has two hundred fifty-
5	eight public schools that serve more than 168,000 students and
6	employs twenty-two thousand teachers, librarians, counselors,
7	educational officers, and other school support staff; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, in the 2021-2022 academic year, the Department of
10	Education experienced a 12.3 percent increase in public school
11	teacher turnover, with nine hundred twenty teachers who resigned
12	and three hundred ten teachers who retired; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, school support staff, such as aides and service
15	staff, are also experiencing a high rate of turnover, with nine
16	hundred thirty-eight school support staff who left the
17	Department of Education in the 2021-2022 academic year; and
18 19	WHEREAS, certain school support personnel, such as
19 20	education assistants, para-professional teachers, part-time
20 21	teachers, and extended hire substitute teachers play a critical
22	role in the classroom by assisting teachers with instruction and
23	one-to-one support for students with special needs; and
24	one to one support for seddenes with spectar needs, and
25	WHEREAS, while school support personnel have extensive
26	experience with instructional delivery, classroom operation, and
27	pedagogy, many school support personnel who choose to enroll in
28	teacher certification programs do not receive course credit for
29	their classroom work and experience; and
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1 WHEREAS, school support personnel must sacrifice a semester 2 of income to complete required student teaching experiences as a 3 requirement to complete teacher education programs that award 4 teacher certification; and 5 6 WHEREAS, school support personnel who are pursuing careers 7 as full-time teachers would benefit from being able to earn 8 9 course credit for their work in the classroom, and by providing more convenient pathways to obtain the requisites to become a 10 full-time teacher more individuals may become interested in 11 pursuing teaching careers, which would help the State's current 12 teacher shortage; now, therefore, 13 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 15 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 16 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 17 Education is requested to partner with the Hawaii State Teachers 18 Association and Hawaii teacher education programs to provide 19 pathways for school support personnel to become full-time 20 teachers; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 23 requested to target educational assistants, para-professional 24 teachers, extended hire substitute teachers, and part-time 25 teachers for the full-time teacher pathway; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 28 requested to collaborate with higher education partners across 29 the State to develop pathways that allow students with relevant 30 work experience in a school support personnel role to be 31 32 credited for work experience towards required course credits; 33 and 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 35 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of 36 Education, Chair of the Board of Education, President of the 37 38 Hawaii State Teachers Association, President of the University 39 of Hawaii, President of Chaminade University of Honolulu, President of Hawaii Pacific University, and President of Brigham 40 Young University Hawaii. 41

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
