HB 2359, HD2, SD1 (SSCR3144) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE HAWAII BROADBAND AND DIGITAL EQUITY OFFICE. Establishes the Digital Equity Grant Program to award grants to applicants to deploy digital equity projects to covered populations in the State. Takes effect 1/1/2060. (SD1)	EET, WAM/JDC
HB 2451, HD3 (SSCR3189) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH. Authorizes examination of defendants via telehealth. Amends conditions for certain petty misdemeanants' release or examination of fitness to proceed. Provides a mechanism for the automatic screening of certain nonviolent defendants for involuntary hospitalization or assisted community treatment. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD3)	HHS/PSM, WAM/JDC
HB 2453, HD1, SD1 (SSCR3183) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO WATER INFRASTRUCTURE. Authorizes the Governor, or a state official with authorization from the Governor, to transfer federal capitalization grant funds between the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund and the Drinking Water Treatment Revolving Loan Fund, in accordance with Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations section 35.3530(c). Takes effect 7/1/3000. (SD1)	HHS, WAM/JDC

HB 2480, HD1, SD1 (SSCR3266) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE CERTIFICATION OF DOCUMENTS. Requires the Office of the Lieutenant Governor to set a fee for the issuance of an apostille or a non-apostille certification by administrative rules. Establishes the Apostilles and Certifications Special Fund. Appropriates funds into and out of the special fund. Declares that the general fund expenditure ceiling is exceeded. Takes effect 7/1/2491. (SD1)	GVO, WAM/JDC
HB 2700, HD3, SD1 (SSCR3349) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO WILDFIRES. Establishes the Hawaii Wildfire Relief Fund and Corporation to provide compensation for property damage resulting from catastrophic wildfires in the State. Creates a process for electric utilities to develop and submit wildfire protection plans to the Public Utilities Commission for approval and allow the recovery of related costs and expenses through securitization, while avoiding a disproportionate impact on a specific ratepayer or county. Declares that the general fund expenditure ceiling is exceeded. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (SD1)	CPN, WAM/JDC
HB 1838, HD2, SD1 (SSCR3292) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO ZONING. Expands the zoning powers of counties. Expands the scope of the transient accommodations tax law to include certain shelters and vehicles with sleeping accommodations. Takes effect 7/1/2040. (SD1)	CPN/EET/GVO, JDC/WAM
HB 1889, HD1, SD1 (SSCR3157) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION MEDICAL BENEFITS. Expands workers' compensation medical benefits for firefighters to include coverage for breast cancer and cancer of the female reproductive organs. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD1)	LBT/PSM, JDC/WAM
<u>HB 2193, HD1, SD1</u> (SSCR3088) <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO FIREWORKS. Takes effect 7/1/2042. (SD1)	PSM, JDC/WAM
HB 2218, HD1, SD1 (SSCR3087) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION ACT. Amends the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act of 1920, as amended, to increase the Ioan limit for direct Ioans provided by the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands from fifty per cent to seventy-five per cent of the maximum single residence Ioan amount allowed in Hawaii by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development's Federal Housing Administration. (SD1)	HWN, JDC/WAM
HB 2443, HD2, SD1 (SSCR3311) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO MEDICAL CANNABIS. Repeals the sunset date of the authorization for primary caregivers to cultivate medical cannabis for qualifying patients. Clarifies that primary caregivers may continue to cultivate medical cannabis for qualifying patients subject to certain restrictions. Increases the maximum number of qualified patients for which each location used to cultivate cannabis may cultivate cannabis from five to ten patients. Effective 12/31/2050. (SD1)	HHS/CPN, JDC/WAM

HB 2471, HD2, SD1 (SSCR3331) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO INSPECTIONS ON PUBLIC LAND. Establishes a statutory framework for inspections of public land leases or licenses by the Department of Land and Natural Resources, including by third-party inspectors contracted by the Department. Effective 7/1/3000. (SD1)	WTL, JDC/WAM
HB 2505, HD1, SD1 (SSCR3334) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO LAND USE. Increases the fines for violations of land use laws. Imposes enhanced fines for developers and owners of important agricultural lands who repeatedly use the lands for unintended purposes. Effective 7/1/3000. (SD1)	WTL, JDC/WAM
