The iconic Banyan tree at ping plaza began, the former site of the Nu'uanu Shopping Mall on School Street is being protected during the renovation of the property by Walgreens Drug Store. When the Nu'uanu TOC that it fully intends Ching presenting mall closed, The Outdoor to protect both trees for Circle (TOC) contacted Walgreens and secured its fit of the people of pledge to protect the old Banyan and a historic Lychee tree in the parking lot. Recently, as demolition at the shop-

PALAMA SETTLEMENT HONORED FOR 100 YEARS OF OUTREACH

PALAMA SETTLEMENT was founded in 1905 by James and Ragna Rath and became fully incorporated in 1910 to bring social change when a fire that broke out in Honolulu's Chinatown left 4,000 residents homeless, amidst a time of sickness,



tragedy, and increasing influx of new immigrants arriving to the islands. Palama Settlement was recognized for 100 years of outreach to the Kalihi and Palama community for providing services to various immigrant communities, including the Japanese, Chinese, Hawaiians, Filipinos, Samoans, Tongans, Laotians, and Micronesians. Palama Settlement has effectively provided a wide range of educational, recreational, athletic, cultural, social, health services and mentoring for at-risk youth, adults, and seniors that

positively enhance the wellbeing of individuals and families, such as the Children's Savings Project, which educates children about finances, and enables Palama Settlement to match each child's savings up to \$20 when a child opens a savings account. While continuing to extend a welcoming hand to perpetuate the generosity that is the soul of Liliha, Palama Settlement is presenting this year's 9th Annual "I Love Liliha" Town Festival.
