Thanks to the help from the Dept. of Housing and Urban Development, Federal Reserve bank of San Francisco and the City & County of Honolulu, on June 26th, over 30 members from the community gathered for the opening reception of the Liliha Revitalization Project Exhibit at Honolulu Hale.

Since February, the office of Representative Ching has been working with the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco.
