CURRENT MOVING BILLS

HB 912 HD 1: Medical Service Coverage by Employer	Requires an employer to pay for all medical services related to an employee's compensable injury. Provides a process for an employer to dispute the payment of a medical bill.
HB 913 HD 1: Relating to the Hawaii Relations Board	Allows the filing of documents with the Hawaii Labor Relations Board by the original paper document or electronically.
HB 914 HD 1: Relating to the Hawaii Relations Board	Clarifies that the party seeking review of a decision and order of the Hawaii Labor Relations Board is to bear the cost of preparing a transcript unless otherwise provided by law, in which case HLRB is to bear the cost of preparing the transcript.
HB 1216 HD 1: Income Tax Credit	Established an income tax credit for taxpayers who own and operate a business from their principal residence.
HB 1217: Voter Registration	Make completion of a voter registration application affidavit a mandatory part of all driver's license and identification card applications. Automatically registers each applicant for voting. Requires sharing of information among the counties, Department of Transportations, and election personnel.
HB 1468 HD 1: Waianae Coast Comprehensive Health Center	Appropriates moneys to the Department of Health to provide the Waianae Coast Comprehensive Health Center with funding for 1 FTE advanced practice registered nurse position and various infrastructure improvements for its school-based health center at Nānākuli High and Intermediate School.
HB 1469 HD 1: Income Tax Deduction	Establishes a state income tax deduction for eligible contributions made to the Hawaii college savings program.
HB 1471: District 43 General Obligation Bonds	Authorizes issuance of general obligation bonds and appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the 43rd District Representative.
