HOLIDAY DRIVE SAFE CAMPAIGN KICK OFF: DECEMBER 5TH


As you may recall in 2007, I was hit head-on by a drunken driver in Kapolei. Subsequently, I introduced a bill that required anyone arrested for drunk driving to install an ignition interlock into their cars. This bill became law in 2008 and went into effect in 2011. According to the national Highway Traffic Safety Administration, drunk driving takes one life every 51 minutes in the United States. In Hawaii over 30% of all fatalities are alcohol related.

2015 marks the 30th anniversary of the Live and Let Live/Drive Safe 4Ewa, Kapolei Campaigns. In past years, you may have seen crashed car displays and signage at the corner of Ft. Barrette Road and Farrington Highway, reminding us to drive safe and sober. Please join me and others from our community on December 5, 2015 at 10:00 a.m. at Kapolei High School, to kick off for our 2015 safe driving campaign.

During the Holiday Season (Thanksgiving through New Year's Day), 2-3 times more people die in alcohol related crashes than the rest of the year. What you can do:

- Have a designated driver prior to going out;
- don't let your friends dive drunk, take their keys;
- if you have been drinking, ask for a ride home or call a taxi/uber/lyft;
- if you are hosting a party, make sure all guest leave sober.
