Pandemic Unemployment Assistance https://pua.hawaii.gov/_/ Behind requests for assistance with Unemployment Insurance claims, my office has received more complaints and requests for intervention about the use of illegal fireworks in the district than anything else.

Weeks before the New Year was upon us, people were already geared up and shooting them off at all hours of the night. And our community isn't the only one impacted by this. As the above photo clearly shows, the State prohibition against the use of aerial fireworks has proved entirely ineffective in curbing their use.

Family pets are terrified by them, as often are small children. And for the rest, these menacing displays of celebration are a startling nuisance that disrupt the otherwise quiet of evenings in our neighborhoods.

Because it is clear that the current law prohibiting their use has proven so ineffective, my staff and I are looking at other means to improve the situation.

I am working with my colleagues at the Legislature, law enforcement, and those familiar with import and harbor opperations to find solutions that work.

Increasing fines won't work because the individuals using them have to be caught first. Not to mention the fact that our law enforcement is already stretched thin protecting our community. So, I am looking at the possibility of increasing inspections of crates at *before* they arrive Honolulu Harbor as one possible solution. I am also looking at potential options to make easier the reporting of violators to law enforcement as well.

As always, I welcome your input and ideas. Only by working together can we truly improve our community.
