DEPT. OF EDUCATION ANNOUNCES PUBLIC SCHOOL BUS CUTS

Aloha!

We recently learned of the very unfortunate news that the Department of Education has decided to cut many bus routes across the state of Hawaii due to budget cuts. As currently planned, approximately 2,000 students across Hawaii will be affected – and roughly one-tenth of total cuts are to take place in the Campbell Complex of schools, including the entire current bus service of Ewa Makai Middle School. I find this unacceptable.

I believe the Department of Education could be doing more to reduce costs and to better use its existing funds. Please see Page 3 of this newsletter for my letter to the Department of Education.

REPAVING OF FT. WEAVER ROAD: AN UPDATE FROM HDOT

The current resurfacing project on Fort Weaver Road runs from Renton Road to Ewa Beach Road. The work ends at Renton Road because the section between Geiger Road to Farrington Highway have previously been widened and repaved.

The resurfacing is an extension of a previous two-phase project. Phase One widened and repaved Fort Weaver Road from four to six lanes in each direction, from Farrington Highway to Aawa Drive completed in 2006. Phase Two widened and repaved Fort Weaver Road from four to six lanes in each direction, from Aawa Drive to Geiger Road. This project was completed in 2009.

Currently, there are no plans to extend the repaving any further than Ewa Beach Road. However, there is always ongoing pavement maintenance and pothole patching in the area at all times.

If there is a pothole problem you can report the location to the DOT Maintenance Branch at 831-6714.

EWA BEACH FIRE STATION RELOCATION

In response to a constituent request, Chief Kenneth Silva of the Honolulu Fire Department has informed my office of the following:

"The Honolulu Fire Department is awaiting completion of the new Ewa Beach Fire Station in the Ocean Pointe Development. The last report provided by the Department of Design and Construction estimated the completion to be in mid-July 2012, however, it is our understanding that the contractor may be having difficulty meeting that schedule. We are hoping that the new station will be ready for occupancy by the end of the summer. As for the disposition of the current Ewa Beach Fire Station, the HFD will continue to maintain the facility as a remote tactical training facility until the Kalaeloa Tactical Training Facility is completed."
