

Women's Legislative Caucus

Members of the bi-partisan Women's Legislative Caucus and I announced ten bills that comprise our 2020 bill package. I introduced a bill (HB2067) that strengthens state and county responses to domestic violence and increases offender accountability.

It was an honor to host the Hawaii Homelessness Summit and listen to reports on current efforts by leaders from each county. Last year in Hawaii County, 715 homeless people moved into permanent housing and 80 percent remained housed for more than two years.

During a live broadcast from the House Chamber, I told viewers about my focus on mental health this session. I introduced measures that establish a clinical social worker scholarship program, add stabilization beds at the State Hospital and create a mental health first aid training program.
