Affordable Housing Conference

Eager to address the rising housing prices, Rep. Sayama spoke with advocates and housing experts at the 2022 Hawaii Affordable Housing Conference. As a result of this conference, Rep. Sayama will seek to redevelop the former Queen Liliuokalani Elementary School to include affordable housing for DOE staff and the public. Redeveloping this underutilized property will help attract and retain young professionals who would otherwise leave Hawaii.

Japan Sister State Delegation

To encourage economic partnership, investment, and tourism, Rep. Sayama traveled with former Governor Ige to Japan. This delegation coincides with the reaffirmation and celebration of Hawaii's Sister State Relationships with Hiroshima and Yamaguchi. To learn about Hiroshima's innovations in education, industry, and energy, Rep. Sayama visited Hiroshima's Carbon Neutral Facility, Mazda Auto Factory, and the Hiroshima Global Academy.

Small Business and Parks

To celebrate the small businesses that are the cornerstone of the Kaimuki community, Rep. Sayama attended and volunteered at the Keep it Kaimuki event in November. After three years, it was wonderful to see businesses fully open and hundreds of residents enjoying the goods and services that Kaimuki small businesses have to offer. 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Bills and Resolutions for 2023

Here are some legislative proposals I'm working on in the 2023 Legislation Session.

Road Usage Charge

As more drivers transition to electric vehicles, the state has been losing revenue from the gas tax needed to repair Hawaii's transportation infrastructure. To find a sustainable funding mechanism, I'm working with DOT to implement a road usage charge for electric vehicles. Instead of pay a \$50-\$70 annual surcharge, EV owners will be charged a fee based on the number of miles driven in the year.

School Psychologist Certification

The pandemic has demonstrated a greater need for mental health professionals to support students and teachers in schools. To examine the effectiveness of a school psychologist position, I'm working with the Auditor to conduct a Sunrise Analysis. Once the report is complete, I will work with DCCA to form a regulatory process to ensure proper licensure for practicing school psychologists.

As the legislature works to increase affordable housing, I'm working with Lieutenant Governor Luke, the School Facility Authority, the DOE, UH, and community Organizations to redevelop the Queen Liliuokalani Elementary School property into a mixed use development for affordable housing for teachers and Pre-K classrooms. This development would help ease the need to affordable housing, help address the teacher shortage, and advance the goal to achieve universal Pre-k.

Nursing License Compact

While Hawaii successfully overcame the challenges of the COVID pandemic, Hawaii continues to face a health care worker shortage. After attending national legislative conferences, I am inspired to explore a Nursing Licensure Compact. This policy would allow nurses licensed under this compact to practice nursing in other participating states. By doing so, I hope reduce regulatory hurdles for out of state nurses to supplement Hawaii's local health care workforce.

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\$2.88 MILLION IN CIP FUNDS FOR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

Representative Sayama remains committed to ensuring that our keiki and teachers have a safe and productive learning environment. We are proud to announce that we have secured \$2.88 Million in CIP funds to address the following needs in our schools.

Ali'iolani Elementary School

• \$200,000 for installation of ceiling fans and heat abatement.

Jarrett Middle School

- \$200,000 for reroofing and providing new LED Lighting.
- \$2,200,000 for repairs and renovations due to drainage and settlement conditions.

Palolo Elementary School

 \$280,000 for installation of ceiling fans and heat abatement.

Kaimuki High School

• \$1,400,000 for campus telecommunication and electrical infrastructure improvements.
