Make Halloween Safe

Halloween is just around the corner and the Center for Disease Control has released a list of guidelines on how to celebrate the holiday safely.

- · Avoid direct contact with trick-or-treaters.
- Give out treats outdoors, if possible.
- · Set up a station with individually bagged treats for kids to take.
- · Wash hands before handling treats.
- . Wear a mask, a costume mask is NOT a substitute for a cloth mask. Do NOT wear a costume mask over a cloth mask. It can make breathing more difficult.
- Bring hand sanitizer with you and use it after touching objects or other people.
- · Use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds when you get home and before you eat any treats.
- Stay at least 6 feet away from others who do not live with you.

1t.org is part of the World Economic Forum's efforts to accelerate nature-based solutions and was set up to support the UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration 2021-2030. The role of Hawai'i was revealed today in a videotaped message from Governor David Ige during virtual or live Global Citizen Events in New York City and Los Angeles. The One Trillion Trees Pledge is a direct approach to achieving net-negative carbon goals, a primary way of combating global warming. The events were expected to have an audience of 100 million people.

Honolulu Parks & Recs Indoor Facility Reopening Timeline

The Honolulu Department of Parks and Recreation is happy to announce that gymnasiums are scheduled to reopen for permitted use next month, along with active use of smaller indoor facilities in November!

The phased reopening of indoor City park facilities for permitted, public use is scheduled under the following timeline:

Sept. 27: DPR begins accepting permit applications for use of gymnasiums Oct. 4: DPR fall classes begin

Oct. 11: DPR begins accepting permit applications for active use of meeting, recreation, multipurpose, and martial art rooms*

Oct. 18: Permitted usage of City park gymnasiums begins

Nov. 1: Permitted usage of City park meeting, recreation, multipurpose, and martial art rooms for physical activities begin.

*Currently, DPR is permitting these facilities for passive use, such as in-person meetings, arts & crafts, or stationary lessons. Active use includes more physical sports, exercises, etc.

Spectators are allowed during these indoor activities, but each facility will have capacity limits which includes participants, coaches, event staff, and spectators. Face coverings are required for all participants, and DPR facilities continue to follow the Safe Access O'ahu Program for proof of vaccination or negative COVID-19 test results..
