2020 JOINT LEGISLATIVE PACKAGE			
Legislative package introduced in the House and Senate to restore income equality to the working class in Hawai'i.			
HB2541	Gradually increases the minimum wage to \$13/hr by 2024. Increases food/excise tax credit based on earned income.		
HB2542	Makes provisions for the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation to increase affordable housing by identifying publicly–owned properties that can be used to develop 99-year leasehold homes. Authorizes funds to establish infrastructure for development projects and provides for tax exemptions.		
HB2543	Creates a Learning to Grow Agency to increase the capacity at existing childcare facilities supported with public funds and also develop new facilities for early learning programs for 3–4 year-old children by 2030.		
HB2544	Appropriates funds to establish the School Facilities Agency to be responsible for all public school development, planning, and construction related to capital improvement projects.

*HB2193	Requires all habitat conservation plans (HCP) to include stand-by emergency services for native wildlife affected by activities subject to the HCP.	*HB2591	Appropriates funds to provide DLNR with necessary resources for statewide consultation with fishers and other stake holders to develop management measures associated with the marine 30x30 initiative.
*HB2196	Increases outreach and compliance over sight for homeowners with on-site sewage disposal systems.	HB1847	Requires DLNR to adopt rules to protect herbivorous fish in all state waters.
HB1121	Requires an update of the statewide frame work for the Hawaii water plan.	HB1860	Bans the sale of sunscreen that includes homosalate, octocrylene, & octisalate.

HB2265	Establishes and funds an invasive species rapid response special fund.	HB1863	Requires a study on the development of electric vehicle infrastructure.
HB2532	Appropriates funds to mitigate and control two-lined spittlebug infestations.	HB1934	Provides a funding source for programs to create jobs relating to clean and renewable energy generation.
		HB2699	Establishes clean ground transportation goals for

# HEALTH & WELL-BEING

- **HB1796** Creates a task force to study capping the amount an insured person can be charged for a prescription insulin drug.
- **HB2022** Authorizes expenditures to expand treatment facilities for patients with chronic substance abuse and mental health disorders.
- **HB2236** Funds review and cost analysis of the State emergency medical system to improve efficiency, quality, and cost-effectiveness.
- **HB2457** Bans the sale of flavored tobacco, authorizes public school teachers to confiscate e-cigarettes, and increases fines for possession of tobacco products by persons under 21.
- HB1945 Allocates TAT funds to the Hawaii Tourism Authority to address homelessness in tourist and resort areas.
- **HB2061** Requires a study group to examine the impacts of allowing child support payments for recipients of the TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) Program.
- **HB2062** Establishes a sexually exploited children statewide coordinator program, and committee to address the needs of sexually exploited children in the state.

#### PUBLIC SAFETY

- \*HB2425 Amends the definition of domestic abuse to include coercive control between family or household members.
- HB2703 Appropriates funds to establish a pilot program to prevent targeted school violence.
- **HB1818** Requires individuals riding a bicycle to ride within a bicycle lane whenever available.

#### AGRICULTURE

- \*HB2192 Increases the maximum area for certain agricultural buildings that are exempt from building permit and building code requirements.
- **HB1892** Requires the Department of Agriculture to establish a five-year food hub pilot program to increase access to local food.
- **HB2689** Requires the Department of Agriculture to establish a permanent hemp program.

#### EDUCATION

- HB1915 Establishes the Workforce Readiness Program to help students develop skills needed to be employable.
- **HB1956** Requires persons under 21 who use tobacco at a public school to attend a tobacco education course.
- \*HB2426 Allows charter school students to participate in sports programs at other DOE schools in their service area.
- **HB2250** Establishes the UH Promise Program Plus to provide scholarships to qualified students who commit to work for at least three years in Hawaii.
- HB2021 Clarifies that DOE may construct teachers' housing on a public school campus and rent it at low or no cost to full-time teachers.

#### GOOD GOVERNANCE

- \*HB 2195 Relieves certain homeowners who condominiumize and sell an adjacent lot from reporting and fee requirements.
- \*HB766 Establishes a task force within the Judiciary to review allowing service of notice and process by electronic mail.
- \*HB1153 Establishes the remote testimony access program which would allow the public to present oral testimony at hearings through remote testimony.
- HB1868 Lowers the age exempted from jury duty from 80 to 75 years of age or older.
- HB2750 Allows a person to renew or obtain a driver's license regardless if they have unpaid monetary obligations, with certain exceptions.

#### **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

- HB1912Establishes the Pacific International SpaceCenter for Exploration Systems.
- **HB2015** Establishes a pilot program to remove and harvest gorse from Mauna Kea and develop it as a marketable product.
- HB2025 Adjusts the deposit beverage container handling fee annually based upon the Consumer Price Index.
- **HB2211** Requires DLNR to issue commercial marine licenses for the taking of marine life for commercial purposes.
- **HB2102** Requires labels on hemp products and establishes a regulatory framework for the availability of hemp products in Hawaii.

#### CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

In addition to passing bills, the Legislature appropriates funding for State capital improvement projects. Among many other important projects, I am advocating for the following major road projects as a top priority for District 7:

#### Daniel K. Inouye Highway (Saddle Road) Extension - \$90,000,000

Land acquisition and construction to extend the highway from Mamalahoa Highway to Queen Ka'ahumanu Highway.

#### Waimea regional safety improvements -\$22,000,000

Design and construction of transportation safety projects across Waimea.

#### Kawaihae Road, Waiaka Bridge Replacement and Realignment - \$4,100,000

Additional funds for land acquisition and design of a new replacement bridge.
