## International Union for Conservation of Nature

Founded in 1948, the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) is the world's oldest and largest global environmental and conservation organization with representation from more than 160 countries. A four-person delegation from IUCN was visiting Hawai'i from February 9 to 16, as we bid to host the IUCN World Conservation Congress (WCC) in 2016.

The IUCN WCC is the leading summit on the environment. Held every four years, it aims to improve how we manage our natural environment for human, social and economic development.

A successful bid for the IUCN WCC could bring as many as 8,000 delegates to Hawai`i in 2016, including leaders from government, the public sector, non-governmental organizations, business, UN agencies and social organizations. It would allow Hawai`i to highlight its conservation efforts to the rest of the world and demonstrate leadership in addressing global environmental and development challenges.
