On the following measure: H.B. 1686, HD1, RELATING TO INSURANCE

Chair Yamashita and Members of the Committee:

My name is Gordon Ito, and I am the Insurance Commissioner of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs' (Department) Insurance Division. The Department offers comments on this bill.

The purpose of this bill is to increase the reimbursement rate for chiropractic treatments for personal injury protection benefits under motor vehicle insurance from \$75 to \$100.

The existing law ensures that consumers injured in automobile accidents can seek a variety of treatments to aid in recovery from injuries. The HD 1 proposes to increase the reimburse from \$75 to \$100 per visit, which would be reasonable. However, it may lead to an increase in motor vehicle insurance premiums.


<u>HB 1686, HD1</u>

Chair Yamashita, Vice Chair Kitagawa, and members of the Committee on Finance, my name is Alison Ueoka, President of Hawaii Insurers Council. The Hawaii Insurers Council is a non-profit trade association of property and casualty insurance companies licensed to do business in Hawaii. Member companies underwrite approximately forty percent of all property and casualty insurance premiums in the state.

Hawaii Insurers Council submits comments on this bill. HB 1686, HD1 increases the chiropractic reimbursement rate under motor vehicle insurance from \$75 per visit to \$100 per visit. This will increase the cost of motor vehicle insurance premiums which will compound a hard market where motor vehicle insurance premiums are already going up and are expected to continue this trend for a few years. In 2024 alone, both the Wall Street Journal and Bankrate have reported on the skyrocketing increases of auto insurance expenditures. Bankrate reported on February 5, 2024, the national average increase for auto insurance premiums was 26% over 2023.

Higher motor insurance premiums may result in a higher number of uninsured motorists and is regressive, penalizing those who can least afford it. In addition, increasing costs to personal injury protection coverage (PIP) which this bill does, could adversely impact other coverages including bodily injury liability, uninsured motorist, and underinsured motorists coverages.

As a dual licensed Chiropractor and Naturopathic Physician, I support this bill and would like to offer comments on the HD1 language. I run a small business which is an outpatient clinic in Hilo, on the Big Island, and have seen first-hand the impact of the restrictions currently in place for motor vehicle incident related healthcare insurance coverage.

I request that you restore the language to that of the original draft rather than the new language used in HD1, which creates a dollar amount restriction on patient care. Accidents and patient situations differ, and since each case is different, putting a universal limit on care is not in the best interest of the patients. We must trust our doctors, who are specialists in patient care, to determine the care needs for individual patients based on what is medically necessary in each case.

Additionally, aligning the reimbursement for care after motor vehicle accidents with the fee schedule for workman's compensation type cases will help to modernize the structure so that we may provide excellent care to our patients while still staying in business. This improvement would also help to tackle rising healthcare costs as many patients currently have to seek additional provider types because under the existing statute reimbursement for additional services beyond the current limit is not available from their chiropractic or naturopathic provider.

I ask that you support this measure and amend it back to its original version, thereby supporting increased access to healthcare for Hawai'i's patient population and a healthy local economy for our doctors in small businesses.
