Aloha Chair DeCoite, Vice Chair Wakai, and Members of the Committee,

The Hawai'i Tourism Authority (HTA) supports the intent of this measure, which requires the Hawai'i Tourism Authority to develop and publish, through a contract with a third party, a mobile application that includes all online application processes, including the collection of any applicable reservation fees, to acquire a reservation to conduct recreational and commercial activities in the State that are regulated by or under the jurisdiction of a state or county agency.

Unifying travel-related interactions with state and local government in a cohesive digital platform for visitors and kama'āina offers many opportunities to make these interactions more seamless for the consumer, and to make destination management more efficient and effective through locationaware deployment of safety and educational messages, and encouraging meaningful itineraries that drive visitors to sites and experiences with the capacity to host them appropriately.

These capabilities would also advance various priority actions identified in HTA's island-based, community-led Destination Management Action Plans.

We have one suggested technical amendment to this measure that would align Section 4 with our current administrative structure. On page 7, lines 14-15, we suggest the following change:

- positions to manage the mobile application, to be hired by [the 14
- 15 board of directors of] the Hawaii tourism authority.

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments on this bill.

House Bill (H.B.) No. 2563, H.D. 2, adds two new sections to Chapter 201B, HRS, to require the Hawaii Tourism Authority (HTA) to develop and publish a mobile application, through contract with a third party, that includes all online application processes to require a permit, license, or reservation needed to conduct recreational and commercial activities in the State that are regulated by or under the jurisdiction of a State or county agency; and to establish outside the treasury the Tourism Enterprise Fund (TEF) to provide a mechanism to collect fees on behalf of State and county agencies and to disburse them to the appropriate agency on a quarterly basis. This bill also appropriates an unspecified amount of general funds for FY 25 to establish an unspecified amount of manager positions to manage the mobile application and to contract for the development and publication of the mobile application.

As a matter of general policy, B&F does not support the creation of any special fund which does not meet the requirements of Section 37-52.3, HRS. Special funds should:

1) serve a need as demonstrated by the purpose, scope of work and an explanation why the program cannot be implemented successfully under the general fund appropriation process; 2) reflect a clear nexus between the benefits sought and charges made upon the users or beneficiaries or a clear link between the program and the sources of revenue; 3) provide an appropriate means of financing for the program or activity; and 4) demonstrate the capacity to be financially self-sustaining. Regarding H.B. No. 2563, H.D. 2, it is difficult to determine whether the proposed special fund would be self-sustaining.

In addition, B&F has concerns with the TEF being established outside of the State treasury as having funds within the State treasury will allow for better investment and fund management.

Lastly, any operating expenses relating to the administration of this mobile application process should be paid for by fees collected for the program in the TEF before distribution to each State or county agency.

- Camping performs online reservations and permit purchasing for City and County of Honolulu Parks
- Summer Fun schedule activities for youth 6 through 17 years old during summer
- Parks Recreational Activities schedule classes at parks and swimming pools
- Facilities Reservation (coming soon) reserve park facilities
- As well as information on parks, gardens, skate parks, and activities available within the City and County of Honolulu

PROS has been in operation since 2020. It integrates scheduling, reservations, payments, notifications, and information awareness into one comprehensive platform for both the public and the Department of Parks and Recreation. No licensing fees nor third-party payments are necessary since DIT staff developed it.

Currently, we are in the process of integrating the City permits within other areas of the City database. We would lose that advantage if we switched to a statewide, multi-jurisdiction system. In addition, we'd basically go backwards, because we'd have to reprogram all the permits we already have online.

We oppose the legislation as it currently stands but recommend the following amendment.

Founded in 1990, Friends of Hanauma Bay is dedicated to the conservation of coastal and marine environments, emphasizing stewardship of the natural resources of Hanauma Bay.

Mahalo for the opportunity to testify in <u>strong opposition to HB2563 HD2</u> that would require the Hawaii Tourism Authority to develop and publish, through a contract with a third party, a mobile application that includes all online application processes, including the collection of any applicable reservation fees, to acquire a reservation to conduct recreational and commercial activities in the State that are regulated by or under the jurisdiction of a state or county agency.

We are strong supporters of a reservation system for Hawaii's sensitive natural resource areas. In fact, we recommended that the City and County of Honolulu implement the first reservation system at Hanauma Bay in 2020 before it reopened the Nature Preserve to visitors after an almost 9 month closure due to the COVID -19 pandemic. However, requiring the HTA to contract a third party to manage this function through an app for all state and county sites eliminates the voice of community stewards and erodes the authority of state and county agencies.

Further, the City and County of Honolulu has already created a reservation system so forcing it to pay a fee, realign its procedures, and wait three months for payment to be part of this new system would be duplicative and more expensive.

If this app must go forward, at least allow for the counties to decide for themselves if they want to participate, and in what capacity.

Either way, we can not support Hanauma Bay's reservation system being managed by this app as described in this bill.

Please defer this bill in your Committee, or amend it to make it optional for the Counties.
