S.B. 2893 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION

Senate Committee on Water and Land

The Hawaii Department of Transportation (HDOT) **supports** this bill which intends to increase traffic safety by allowing the director of transportation to exempt certain ground transportation facility projects from historic preservation review and the environmental impact statement law, subject to certain conditions.

The HDOT appreciates the Legislature's concern for the safety of all users of the highway system and for seeking to streamline the historic and environmental review portions of the project development process. The HDOT notes that projects considered a Federal undertaking, those that utilize federal funds or require a federal approval, will still need to follow requirements of federal law, including Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 and National Environmental Policy Act.

Aloha Chair, Vice Chair, and members of the committee,

I stand in opposition to SB2893.

While I understand that the bill is directed to projects that are on previously disturbed areas and do not require excavation of soil greater than 24 inches, that still leaves open the possibilities of previously disturbed areas that did not disturb down 24 inches previously, thus there is still a high possibility of the area having archaeological sites or burial sites. I also feel that, projects could also have an environmental impact and that should be studied as well. Due the possibility of projects being a greater disturbance than previous projects on the same site, as well as the possibility of having environmental impacts, I am opposed to this bill and do not think these projects should be exempt from historic preservation review and environmental impact statement law.
