Aloha Chairs Aquino and Wakai, Vice-Chairs Moriwaki and Elefante, and members of both committees:

I am MG Kenneth S. Hara, Adjutant General and Director of Hawaii Emergency Management Agency, State of Hawaii, Department of Defense.

The Department of Defense (DEF) provides written testimony in **SUPPORT** of SB3085.

This measure amends Hawai'i Revised Statutes (HRS), Chapter 121 and authorizes the use of State funds to pay for TRICARE Reserve Select (TRS) coverage for Hawai'i National Guard (HING) Servicemembers in the junior grades for officers in the grade of O-3 and below and warrant officers in the grades of CW-2 and below, and for enlisted in the grades of E-6 and below while serving on State Active Duty (SAD) for more than thirty days in service to the State. TRS coverage would include the individual officer, warrant officer or enlisted and their family, should they have eligible dependents.

The HING places great value on selfless service to the State of Hawai'i, as well as the well-being of the dedicated women and men of the HING who support the State during times of need.

We have seen a recent increase in natural disasters throughout the State, which has caused numerous HING Servicemembers to be ordered to SAD in response for extended periods. HING Servicemembers have been asked to serve in an indeterminate timeframe, requiring them to take a leave of absence from their civilian employers for longer periods of duty. While some civilian employers may elect to pay for the HING Servicemembers' ongoing company-provided healthcare premiums while on a leave of absence status, many civilian employers will not. As a result, many HING Servicemembers will lose their civilian company-provided healthcare coverage after 30 days on SAD orders. This requires HING Servicemembers serving the State on SAD to constantly reconsider whether they should continue serving without any healthcare coverage or request for termination of their SAD orders to keep their company-provided healthcare coverage for themselves and their families. To require HING Servicemembers to support the State on SAD without any healthcare coverage is an unfair request, especially since the State is already asking them to take an indefinite leave of absence from their civilian employer to support the State's emergency.

When HING Servicemembers exceed 90 days on SAD orders they would be entitled to certain benefits from the State of Hawai'i as a temporary State employee, such as access to the Employer-Union Trust Fund (EUTF). However, the cost of enrollment in the EUTF would be substantially more than the premium cost for enrollment in TRS coverage.

TRS provides the most fiscally responsible solution for the State to offer healthcare coverage to HING Servicemembers serving on SAD for more than 30 days. The individual plan premium cost for TRS is approximately \$50 per month and the family plan premium cost is approximately \$240 per month. Comparatively, the State of Hawaii employer-sponsored monthly cost for an individual plan is approximately \$450 per month and for a family plan is approximately \$1,500 per month.

If passed, the bill will authorize the use of State funds, such as the Major Disaster Fund (MDF), to compensate HING Servicemembers that require healthcare coverage for their enrollment cost in TRS during their activation on SAD for more than 30 days. This will help ensure healthcare coverage for HING Servicemembers and their eligible dependents, an uninterrupted HING response force capability to the State, and the most cost-effective stewardship of State funds.

Chairs Aquino and Wakai, Vice-Chairs Moriwaki and Elefante, and members of both committees:

I am Colonel Tyson Tahara, Chief of Staff of the Hawai'i Army National Guard (HIARNG) in the State Department of Defense.

The HIARNG provides written testimony **IN SUPPORT OF** SB 3085.

The HIARNG takes great pride in serving the people and government of the State of Hawai'i during times of need. Our recent service history includes our response during the Puna lava flow, our state-wide support during COVID-19, and our deployment to Maui following the wildfires there.

While our Soldiers quickly respond to calls from the community and place themselves in harm's way, they do not receive comprehensive health insurance coverage for their periods of State Active Duty (SAD) service. Many of our Soldiers have and use health insurance coverage provided through their civilian employment, but a sizeable minority do not have health insurance coverage. Additionally, for periods of absence exceeding 30 days, many employers suspend health insurance coverage. The result is that Soldiers and their families may lapse insurance coverage when they are called to serve their State for periods exceeding 30 days.

This bill would grant an allowance for TRICARE Reserve Select coverage for Hawaii National Guard (HING) Servicemembers in the junior grades, for officers in the grade of O-3 and below, warrant officers in the grades of CW-2 and below, and for enlisted in the grades of E-6 and below while serving on SAD service for more than 30 days. This allowance will alleviate the stress placed on our Soldiers and their families during service to our State. Removing the Soldiers' concerns about health insurance coverage will increase the available volunteer pool and improve the HING's response to future emergencies within the State.

Thank you for this opportunity to offer testimony **IN SUPPORT OF** SB 3085 providing an allowance for Tricare Reserve Select.

Dear Honorable Members of the Hawaii State Legislature,

As President of the Hawaii National Guard Association, I represent the dedicated service members of the Army and Air National Guard in our state. It is from this position of advocacy and responsibility that I express our support for SB3085. This bill is critical as it authorizes the provision of TRICARE Reserve Select health insurance allowances to junior officers, warrant officers, or enlisted personnel of the Hawaii National Guard who are ordered to active duty for periods exceeding 30 days.

The absence of a mechanism to provide health insurance for our service members when activated for state duties presents a significant challenge. Currently, when called to state active duty for more than a month, many do not have medical insurance to cover routine healthcare or emergencies for themselves or their families, unless directly related to their service duties. This gap in coverage can lead to substantial personal and financial hardship in the event of medical needs.

Moreover, civilian employers are not required to maintain health coverage for employees who are on active duty. This situation can leave our service members without necessary health care protection, adding undue stress and financial burden, which could detract from their mission focus and effectiveness.

SB3085 addresses this issue by enabling the payment of health insurance allowances, safeguarding the health of our service members and their families during their active duty service. This provision is a practical step that ensures our National Guard can maintain their readiness and capability to serve our state effectively.

Passage of this bill would demonstrate the Hawaii State Legislature's support for our Hawaii service members' welfare and readiness, enabling them to serve without the added concern of healthcare coverage for themselves and their families.
