The University of Hawai'i is confident that the School of Architecture either through the Graduate Certificate Program or through our very successful Community Design Center could play an active role in the creation of such a task force and in helping to develop a working list of significant places.

With regards to the expected work by the task force, there may be some redundancy since these lists already exist in several different contexts.
