

## HB105 HD1 RELATING TO LICENSE PLATES House Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs

The Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) <u>SUPPORTS</u> HB105 HD1, which would require license plates to include 'okina in furtherance of the recognition for 'Ōlelo Hawai'i as one of two official languages of the State of Hawai'i.

OHA would like to emphasize that the development and use of 'okina and kahakō were to provide the necessary distinction in the appropriate pronunciation of words as the language evolved and transformed from predominantly spoken to include written. In written 'Ōlelo Hawai'i, the use of diacritical marks, like 'okina, maintain the same critical importance as the recognized letters of the Hawaiian language alphabet, in that their absence or presence in word can result in a completely different meaning.

The use of 'okina in license plates may seem insignificant, however, the proper respect afforded to maintaining the integrity of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i in its written and spoken forms is monumental.

OHA appreciates the opportunity to SUPPORT this measure and urges the Committee to <u>PASS</u> HB105 HD1. Mahalo nui loa.

SUBJECT: H.B. 105 HD1 - Relating To License Plates HEARING: Thursday, February 16, 2023, 2:00 p.m.

The City and County of Honolulu, Department of Customer Services (CSD) strongly supports this bill.

Currently, Hawaii Revised Statutes § 249-9(a)(1) provides that all license plates shall bear the word "Hawaii" along the upper portion of the plate and the words "Aloha State" along the lower portion of the plate. As written, current law does not allow for the inclusion of the 'okina in the word "Hawaii." This measure will change that.

Last year, the Legislature passed Act 170 which requires Hawaiian diacritical markings in Hawaiian names and words in official State and County letterhead. We support further expansion of the use of Hawaiian diacritical marks in other aspects of government, including our State license plates.

Thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony in support of H.B. 105 HD1.
