Fiscal Implications: Funding estimated at \$1,600,000 annually would be needed for the

2 Department of Health to implement this measure plus any annual cost-of-living increases. The

3 Department requests that passage of any appropriations in this measure does not replace or

4 adversely impact priorities indicated in the Executive supplemental budget request.

5 Department Testimony: The Department of Health (DOH) appreciates the intent of H.B. 1245
6 H.D. 1.

7 Central Maui may be defined as the towns of Kahului, Wailuku, and Paia. Currently, there is 1

8 ambulance stationed in Kahului and 1 in Wailuku. The population of central Maui between 2010

9 – 2020 increased 9.0% from 50,215 to 54,721. Ambulance run data collected between 2017 –

10 2022 reveals annual transports averaged 3,900. Ambulance response times averaged 8.8 minutes.

11 Although the bill as written appropriates \$1.5 million for a second ambulance for Central Maui,

the FY23 price is \$1.6 million.

13 Although response times are relatively low, given the population is increasing, a central

14 ambulance may be needed in the near future.

SUBJECT: HEARING OF FEBRUARY 16, 2023; TESTIMONY IN <u>SUPPORT</u> OF HB 1245, HD1, RELATING TO RELATING TO AMBULANCES

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in **support** of this important measure. The purpose of this measure is to appropriate funds to the Department of Health for the purchase of an advanced life-support ambulance and related equipment to be based in Central Maui and to fund pay-related costs for State-certified emergency medical services personnel.

The Maui County Council has not had the opportunity to take a formal position on this measure. Therefore, I am providing this testimony in my capacity as an individual member of the Maui County Council.

I support this measure for the following reasons:

- 1. The significant population growth in Central Maui warrants additional emergency services.
- 2. The area would benefit greatly from adding an advanced life-support ambulance, related equipment, and personnel (one emergency medical technician and one paramedic).
- 3. An additional ambulance would help reduce death and disability among visitors and residents by ensuring timely response to 911 emergency calls.
- 4. This measure is consistent with Maui Island Plan policy 4.6.1.f: "Encourage expansion and improved access to emergency care in all communities."

For the foregoing reasons, I **support** this measure.
