Chair Yamashita and Members of the Committee:

The Department of the Attorney General (Department) supports this bill and offers the following comments.

The existing bribery statute, section 710-1040, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), is a class B felony offense. This bill seeks to increase the degree of offense for the offense of Bribery to a class A felony if the public servant is an elected or appointed official, the value of the bribe exceeds \$20,000, or the person commits three or more acts of bribery as described in section 710-1040(1), HRS, within a three-year period.

The Department respectfully recommends deleting the wording on page 2, line 19, "notwithstanding any law to the contrary" as follows:

(5) A person convicted of violating this section[<del>,</del> notwithstanding any law to the contrary,] shall not be eligible for a deferred acceptance of guilty plea or nolo contendere plea under chapter 853.

Section 710-1040(5) (currently section 710-1040(4)) clearly states that a person convicted of violating section 710-1040, HRS, is not eligible for the deferred acceptance of guilty plea or nolo contendere plea that is allowed under chapter 853, HRS. See page 2, lines 18-21. The wording "notwithstanding any law to the contrary" appears to be extraneous and may cause unnecessary confusion and unintended negative consequences.

This bill will provide law enforcement with tools to adequately deter and commensurately punish public corruption. We respectfully ask the Committee to pass the bill with the recommended amendment.

## RE: H.B. 126, H.D. 1; RELATING TO PUBLIC CORRUPTION.

Chair Yamashita, Vice Chair Kitagawa, and members of the House Committee on Finance, the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney of the City and County of Honolulu ("Department") submits the following testimony in <u>strong support</u> of H.B. 126, H.D. 1. This bill is part of the Department's 2023 legislative package, and we thank you for hearing it.

The purpose of H.B. 126, H.D. 1 is to increase penalties for bribery from a class B felony to a class A felony, if:

- the offender was an elected or appointed official;
- the aggregate value involved exceeded \$20,000; or
- the offense was comprised of 3 or more occurrences within a 3 year period.

Given the years of scandal that have shaken the public's trust in Hawaii's state and local government, the Department believes that our state laws should be amended to reflect the egregious nature of certain offenses—such as bribery—that involve a serious abuse of authority, or betray the public's trust to a heightened degree. Every day, thousands of dedicated government workers serve the public diligently and honorably, and their hard work and good reputation should not be marred by those who would selfishly seek their own profits.

While federal prosecutors have largely taken the lead in prosecuting recent incidents of government officials being bribed, this is largely due to the greater effectiveness and severity of federal laws on the matter. To better equip county prosecutors with the tools to prosecute this type of public corruption, the State also needs more effective laws with serious consequences. We believe H.B. 126, H.D. 1 would do so in a reasonable manner.

For all of the foregoing reasons, the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney of the City and County of Honolulu <u>strongly supports</u> the passage of H.B. 126, H.D. 1. Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this matter.
