<u>DEPARTMENT'S POSITION</u>: The Department of Human Services (DHS) supports this bill, makes recommendations, and defers to the Department of Health on implementation.

<u>PURPOSE:</u> This bill establishes an early intervention services working group within the Department of Health to study and recommend ways to assist and support deaf and hard of hearing children, including implementation strategies. Requires report to legislature. Appropriates funds. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD1) The HD1 defected the effective date and made technical amendments.

Each year DHS, Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR), provides vocational rehabilitation services to over 200 Deaf and Hard of Hearing clients statewide. Many of these clients did not have early intervention services when they were young. Research shows that early intervention has a very positive impact on a child's development and children's academic performance. We understand early intervention services will significantly positively impact future clients accessing DVR's program services designed to support the needs of Hawaii's residents who identify as Deaf and Hard of Hearing.

The Department also recommends including Deaf and Hard of Hearing individuals and parents of Deaf and Hard of Hearing children as members of the Work Group. As drafted, there are no Deaf and Hard of Hearing individuals or parents of Deaf and Hard of Hearing children identified in the Work Group. Although the Work Group may appoint additional members and a representative of a Deaf and Hard of Hearing organization is on the Work Group, including this critical population will be invaluable to developing effective strategies to address needed support and implementing best practices for early intervention services.

If the measure passes, DHS will participate in the working group.
