Chair Wakai and Members of the Committee:

The Department strongly supports this bill.

This bill amends sections 134-83 and 846-2.7(43), Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to permit the county police departments to conduct fingerprint-based criminal background checks through the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) on applicants for licenses to sell electric guns. The counties can currently verify an applicant's Hawaii criminal conviction record through the Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center. Without the ability to conduct NCIC background checks, however, counties cannot readily conduct a search for convictions in other states. This bill will provide the counties with reliable confirmation that the sellers of electric guns do not have disqualifying criminal convictions in other states.

The Department appreciates the opportunity to submit testimony in support of this bill.

Comments:

I stand in opposition to this bill. At a time when violent attacks are increasing and there is a concern about people carrying firearms for self defense the state would be trying to encourage people to purchase less-than-lethal self defense options rather than discouraging them and adding an unneeded nuisance to dealers.

The FBI has already told HPD in no uncertain terms that they cannot use their NICS system to conduct background checks on non-firearms purchases when they tried to do background checks on dealers when tasers were first legalized. To comply with this the Police Departments will have to do a national background check on their own, meaning they will have to dedicate an officer to doing so when we are already short by about 400 officers. I have heard that one officer has even threatened to quit over a heavily increased workload when he was assigned to process Conceal Carry Permits.

This bill is unnecessary, as the vast majority of authorized taser dealers are already Federal Firearms Licensees, a license which you cannot hold if you are a prohibited person. And those who are not FFL holders would already be prohibited by current State law to acquire their stock if they are prohibited persons.

Hawaii Firearms Coalition **OPPOSES HB981** as it is not necessary for sellers to have background checks to sell electric guns.

In the vast majority of states, electric guns are sold without any requirements and restrictions on sellers or buyers indicating that there are no concerns about their sale. Electric guns can be purchased through mail order and Amazon.com in those states and mailed to a person's home.

Hawaii already implements additional tracking and business permitting requirements by sellers. Requiring background checks is not necessary with these current requirements while having the negative effects of increasing the already high cost of doing business in Hawaii.
