TESTIMONY ON SENATE BILL 786, SD1 RELATING TO SEARCH AND RESCUE Before the Senate Committees on Judiciary and Ways and Means Friday, March 3, 2023; 10:00 a.m. State Capitol Conference Room 211, Via Videoconference

WRITTEN TESTIMONY ONLY

Chairs Rhoads and Dela Cruz, Vice Chairs Gabbard and Keith-Agaran, and members of the Committees:

The Department of Law Enforcement (DLE) strongly supports this bill.

This bill changes the circumstances when an agency may seek reimbursement for search and rescue costs by providing guidance on when such costs can be recovered and requiring agencies to seek reimbursement.

State law enforcement is regularly called upon to participate in search and rescue operations for people who have ignored posted warnings, left defined hiking trails, and ventured into closed areas that have been posted. These situations are not the standard search and rescue of lost or injured persons which are anticipated and part of expected operations of first responders. These are situations created by reason of an individual's choice to ignore warnings and efforts of government agencies or private landowners to keep them safe. When first responders are called upon to engage in these types of extensive search and rescue operations, ongoing operations must be put on hold and agencies often incur additional unbudgeted costs and expense. Requiring agencies to pursue reimbursement in these situations is a reasonable requirement.

SUBJECT: Senate Bill No. 786, S.D. 1, Relating to Search and Rescue

I am Major Shellie Paiva of the Specialized Services Division of the Honolulu Police Department (HPD), City and County of Honolulu.

The HPD opposes Senate Bill No. 786, S.D. 1, Relating to Search and Rescue. This bill requires government agencies to seek reimbursement for search or rescue expenses from certain persons if the need for the search or rescue was caused by the person's disregard of posted warnings and closure signage. The HPD opposes this bill as there is no existing mechanism to seek reimbursement for these situations. In addition, it may deter or delay prompt notification of first responder agencies by persons who may need to be rescued. Such a delay in a request for assistance could make the situation worse and further endanger the lives of those persons as well as first responders.

The HPD urges you to oppose Senate Bill No. 786, S.D. 1, Relating to Search and Rescue.
