ACT 004 H.B. NO. **(899**

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE SNAILS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's land snails 2 have a significant role in native ecosystems. Hawaii's land 3 snails act as fungivores that scrape fungus from plants to promote plant health, decompose decaying material for plant 4 5 nutrients, and are a major component of intact watershed forest 6 communities. These snails may also serve as a food source for 7 other native species. In Hawaiian culture, snails such as 8 kāhuli, pūpūkanioe, and pūpū kuahiwi have a significant role in 9 native songs, hula, and chants and are a symbol of romance and omens. Furthermore, land snails are among the most threatened 10 of all animal groups in the world, with more recorded 11 12 extinctions than birds and mammals combined.

13 The legislature further finds that designating certain 14 species as official state snails that are emblematic of Hawaii 15 will increase awareness of the imperiled status and cultural and 16 ecological relevance of all Hawaiian land snails, preserve their

cultural and ecological significance, and encourage continued
conservation of native Hawaiian invertebrates.

3 The legislature also finds that previous legislation in 4 2020 would have designated a single species as the state snail 5 and that, due to the geographic variability of snails and their 6 close ties to particular islands, the senate standing committee 7 on government operations invited the Bishop Museum and 8 department of land and natural resources to suggest multiple 9 snails species to be designated as official state snails to 10 better represent the diversity of the Hawaiian Islands.

11 The legislature finds that 2023 was proclaimed "Year of the 12 Kāhuli", during which the Bishop Museum organized a statewide snail voting campaign to give voice to the community in deciding 13 14 which snail species to recommend to the legislature to be 15 designated as the official state snail for each island. As a 16 result, Hawaii's K-12 students and community members from across the State voted to establish snails that are emblematic of the 17 18 distinctive flora and fauna of the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands 19 and each island in Hawaii.

1	The purpose of this Act is to designate official state
2	snails based on the results of the Bishop Museum community
3	outreach and voting process.
4	SECTION 2. Chapter 5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
5	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
6	read as follows:
7	" <u>§5-</u> State snails. (a) Hini hini kua mauna (Succinea
8	konaensis) is established and designated as the official snail
9	of the island of Hawaiʻi.
10	(b) Pūpū kua mauna (Lyropupa striatula) is established and
11	designated as the official snail of the island of Maui.
12	(c) Pūpū kua mauna (Pleuropoma laciniosa kahoolawensis) is
13	established and designated as the official snail of the island
14	of Kahoʻolawe.
15	(d) Pūpū kuahiwi (Auriculella lanaiensis) is established
16	and designated as the official snail of the island of Lāna'i.
17	(e) Pūpū kuahiwi (Laminella venusta) is established and
18	designated as the official snail of the island of Moloka'i.
19	(f) Kāhuli (Kaala subrutila) is established and designated
20	as the official snail of the island of O'ahu.

1	(g) Erinna newcombi is established and designated as the
2	official snail of the island of Kauaʻi.
3	(h) Kahelelaniʻilaʻula (Collonista verruca) is established
4	and designated as the official snail of the island of Ni'ihau.
5	(i) Naka kua mauna (Endodonta christenseni) is established
6	and designated as the official snail of the Northwestern
7	Hawaiian Islands."
8	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
