A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DIGITAL VOTER INFORMATION GUIDE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 11-122, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 2 3 "[+]\$11-122[+] Digital voter information guide. (a) The office of elections shall: 4 5 Prepare a digital voter information guide, which shall be posted on the office of elections website in a 6 screen reader-accessible format for voters with 7 special needs who are unable to read standard print 8 due to disability; 9 Provide a translation of the digital voter information 10 (2) 11 quide in Olelo Hawaii on its website; and Provide printed copies of the digital voter 12 (3) information guide to all public libraries for viewing 13 14 by the public. The digital voter information guide shall include: 15 (b) 16 (1)A photograph and short statement of less than one hundred fifty words for each candidate running for 17

1		public office, to be prepared by the candidate;
2		provided that the office of elections may uniformly
3		limit the number of words for the candidate statement
4		by applicable public office;
5	(2)	The explanation drafted by the department of the
6		attorney general of each state constitutional
7		amendment that will be proposed to voters in the next
8		general election pursuant to section 11-118.5(b);
9		provided that the department of the attorney general
10		shall transmit the materials required by this
11		paragraph to the office of elections no later than
12		seventy-five days before the general election;
13	(3)	A clear and concise explanation, drafted by the
14		appropriate county corporation counsel, for each
15		proposed county charter amendment, proposed
16	44	initiative, and proposed referendum issue; provided
17		that the respective corporation counsel shall:
18		(A) Translate the explanation into Olelo Hawaii and
19		any other languages required under the federal
20		Voting Rights Act, as specified by the office of
21		elections; and

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7	(b) Italismic the materials required by this paragraph
2	to the office of elections no later than
3	seventy-five days before the general election; and
4	(4) Information regarding mailing deadlines, places of
5	deposit locations, same day voter registration,
6	accessible voting locations, and opening hours of
7	voter service centers.
8	(c) The office of elections shall prepare and mail with
9	each ballot for a primary election a notice to voters that a
10	digital voter information guide is available on the office of
11	elections website. The notice shall be sent by electronic mail
12	to all voters with special needs who have registered to receive
13	alternate format ballots.
14	(d) Information made available over the Internet pursuant
15	to this section shall meet or exceed the most current, ratified
16	standards under section 508 of the federal Rehabilitation Act of
17	1973 (29 U.S.C. 794d), as amended, and the Web Content
18	Accessibility Guidelines 2.0 adopted by the World Wide Web
19	Consortium for accessibility.
20	(e) Notwithstanding chapter 92F and any other law to the
21	contrary, the contents of subsection (b) shall not be released

- 1 to any requestor in whole or in part before the public release
- 2 of the entire guide."
- 3 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
