A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE TRAFFIC CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 291C-111, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 2 3 "(a) With respect to highways and property under their respective jurisdictions, the director of transportation [is] 4 5 shall be authorized to and the counties by ordinance may prohibit or restrict the stopping, standing, or parking of 6 7 vehicles where the stopping, standing, or parking is dangerous 8 to those using the highway or where the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles would unduly interfere [unduly] with the 9 10 free movement of traffic; provided that the violation of any law or any ordinance, regardless of whether established under this 11 12 or any other section, prohibiting or restricting the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles shall constitute a traffic 13 infraction. The counties may issue traffic infractions for 14 violations of any law prohibiting or restricting the stopping, 15 16 standing, or parking of vehicles on all highways and county 17 property. The counties shall not provide any other penalty,

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civil or criminal, or any other charge, in the form of rental or
 otherwise, in place of or in addition to the fine to be imposed
 by the district court for any violation of any ordinance
 prohibiting or restricting the stopping, standing, or parking of
 vehicles.

This section shall not be construed as prohibiting the 6 7 authority of the director of transportation or the counties to 8 allow the stopping, standing, or parking of motor vehicles at a "T-shaped" intersection on highways under their respective 9 10 jurisdictions; provided that [such] the stopping, standing, or parking of motor vehicles is not dangerous to those using the 11 12 highway or where the stopping, standing, or parking of motor 13 vehicles would not unduly interfere with the free movement of 14 traffic.

15 The appropriate police department <u>or their designee</u>, and 16 county or prosecuting attorney of the various counties shall 17 enforce any law or ordinance prohibiting or restricting the 18 stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles, including but not 19 limited to the issuance of parking tickets. Any person 20 committing a violation of any law or ordinance, regardless of 21 whether established under this or any other section, prohibiting

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1 or restricting the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles
2 shall be subject to a fine to be enforced and collected by the
3 district courts of this State and to be deposited into the state
4 general fund for state use."

5 SECTION 2. Section 291C-165, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

7 "(a) There shall be provided for use by authorized police officers, or [county employees designated by] designees of the 8 county chiefs of police, a form of summons or citation for use 9 in citing violators of those traffic laws that do not mandate 10 the physical arrest of violators. The form and content of the 11 summons or citation shall be as adopted or prescribed by the 12 administrative judge of the district courts and shall be printed 13 on a form commensurate with the form of other summonses or 14 citations used in modern methods of arrest, so designed to 15 include all necessary information to make the same valid within 16 the laws and regulations of the State." 17

18 SECTION 3. Section 291C-167, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 19 amended to read as follows:

20 "\$291C-167 Summons or citation on illegally parked
21 vehicle. Whenever any motor vehicle without a driver is found

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parked or stopped in violation of any of the restrictions
contained in the state traffic laws, the officer or [designated
county cmployee] designee finding the vehicle shall take its
registration number and may take any other information displayed
on the vehicle that may identify its registered owner and
[conspicuously] shall conspicuously affix to the vehicle a
citation, as described in section 291C-165, for the registered
owner of record to answer as provided in chapter 291D."
SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
begun before its effective date.
SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

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SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketeand stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

14 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
