A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MINORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 346-17.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended as follows:
- 3 1. By amending subsection (e) to read:
- 4 "(e) Any provider who renders no cost emergency shelter
- 5 and related services to a minor pursuant to subsections (a) and
- 6 (b) [of this section] and can demonstrate compliance with this
- 7 section shall be immune from any civil or criminal liability
- 8 based on the provider's determination to provide the shelter and
- 9 related services; provided that if a provider's assessment and
- 10 determination, or conduct in providing no cost emergency shelter
- 11 and related services, is the result of the provider's gross
- 12 negligence or wilful or wanton acts or omissions, the provider
- 13 may be held liable for the provider's gross negligence or wilful
- 14 or wanton acts or omissions."
- 15 2. By amending subsection (h) to read:
- "(h) For purposes of this section:
- 17 "Minor" means a person less than eighteen years of age.

"No cost emergency shelter and related services" means

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1	"Provider" means any child placing organization, or child		
2	caring institution authorized by the department under section		
3	346-17 to receive or place minor children for care and		
4	maintenance and to provide related services, health care, or		
5	supplies to these minors. "Provider" includes an organization		
6	that is not a child placing organization or child caring		
7	institution that:		
8	(1)	Conducts criminal history clearances, child abuse and	
9		neglect (CA/N) registry checks, background,	
10		employment, and any other checks as may be required by	
11		state or federal law on an annual basis for all	
12		employees and volunteers;	
13	(2)	Maintains separate sleeping areas for unrelated adults	
14		and minor children;	
15	(3)	Serves no more than five minor children per day;	
16	(4)	Keeps a current register of all minors admitted; and	
17	(5)	Coordinates with the department to provide shelter or	
18		other services for a minor child."
