A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMPLIANCE ON HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that illegal activity 2 occurring on Hawaiian home lands threatens the health and safety of the community. The purpose of this Act is to establish a 3 compliance and enforcement program within the department of 4 Hawaiian home lands to investigate complaints, conduct 5 6 investigations, and cooperate with enforcement authorities to ensure compliance with state law, including the Hawaiian Homes 7 Commission Act, 1920, as amended, and the rules adopted 8 thereunder, as well as all other state laws and rules and county 9 10 ordinances on Hawaiian home lands.

SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

"CHAPTER

COMPLIANCE ON HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS

16 § -1 Compliance and enforcement program on Hawaiian home
17 lands; established. The department of Hawaiian home lands shall



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establish a compliance and enforcement program on Hawaiian home 1 lands to enforce state laws, rules, and regulations, and county 2 ordinances, rules, and regulations on Hawaiian home lands and 3 4 shall employ or appoint, and remove, the following persons, subject to chapter 76 and section 78-1, who shall be provided 5 with suitable badges or insignia of office by the department of 6 Hawaiian home lands: 7 8 An enforcement chief of the department of Hawaiian (1)home lands, who shall be the head of the compliance 9 10 and enforcement program and shall have charge, direction, and control, subject to the direction and 11 12 control of the chair of the Hawaiian homes commission, of all matters relating to compliance with the 13 Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, as amended, and 14 15 rules adopted thereunder as well as all other state laws, rules, and regulations, and county ordinances, 16 rules, and regulations on Hawaiian home lands and such 17 other matters as the chair of the Hawaiian homes 18 19 commission may from time to time direct. The 20 enforcement chief shall be an administrator 21 experienced in law enforcement and management; and



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(2) Personnel and enforcement officers of the compliance 1 2 and enforcement program on Hawaiian home lands, including but not limited to enforcement officers on a 3 4 voluntary basis and without pay. -2 Compliance and enforcement program on Hawaiian home 5 S lands enforcement officers. The compliance and enforcement 6 program on Hawaiian home lands enforcement officers, with 7 respect to all Hawaiian home lands shall: 8 Investigate complaints, gather evidence, conduct 9 (1)investigations, and conduct field observations and 10 inspections as required or assigned; 11 Cooperate with enforcement authorities of the State, 12 (2) counties, and federal government in development of 13 programs and mutual aid agreements for compliance and 14 15 enforcement activities on Hawaiian home lands; Cooperate with established search and rescue agencies 16 (3) 17 of the counties and the federal government in 18 developing plans and programs and mutual aid 19 agreements for search and rescue activities on 20 Hawaiian home lands;



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Check and verify all homestead leases, general leases, 1 (4)permits, and licenses and all other land dispositions 2 issued by the department of Hawaiian home lands; 3 Enforce the laws relating to firearms, ammunition, and 4 (5) dangerous weapons contained in chapter 134; and 5 Carry out other duties and responsibilities as the 6 (6) 7 department of Hawaiian home lands from time to time 8 may direct. -3 Department of Hawaiian home lands; police powers. 9 S 10 The Hawaiian homes commission shall have police powers. The 11 chair of the Hawaiian homes commission may appoint and 12 commission enforcement officers within the compliance and 13 enforcement program on Hawaiian home lands. Persons appointed and commissioned under this section shall have and may exercise 14 15 all of the powers and authority of a police officer, including the power of arrest, and may enforce all state laws and rules, 16 and county ordinances on Hawaiian home lands; provided that such 17

18 powers shall remain in force and effect only while in actual 19 performance of their duties, which shall include off-duty 20 employment when such employment is for other state departments 21 or agencies. These enforcement officers shall consist of



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personnel whose primary duty will be the enforcement of state
 and local laws on Hawaiian home lands and to carry out work
 related to compliance with Hawaiian home lands leases, permits,
 and other requirements.

5 § -4 Rules. The department of Hawaiian home lands may
6 promulgate rules, pursuant to chapter 91, necessary for
7 administration of this chapter."

8 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000 or so much 10 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the 11 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 12 2024-2025 for the compliance and enforcement program on Hawaiian 13 home lands.

14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 15 of Hawaiian home lands for the purposes of this Act.

16 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;17 provided that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
