

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a severe
- 2 shortage of mental health providers in the State. This shortage
- 3 is due to a lack of appropriately educated individuals and high
- 4 rates of turnover in the field, which is exacerbated by
- 5 compassion fatigue, burnout, and inadequate preparation for
- 6 mental health serving positions.
- 7 The legislature further finds that Windward community
- 8 college, in collaboration with the Hawaii state hospital, has
- 9 developed a mental health technician certificate of competence
- 10 program. The coursework for the certificate program addresses
- 11 the immediate and critical workforce needs of preparing
- 12 potential employees and upskilling existing employees. These
- 13 certificates are also a foundation to increasingly higher
- 14 qualifications, as the initial certificate of competence opens a
- 15 pathway to further training and development. A one-year
- 16 certificate program currently under development will build on
- 17 the skills developed by the existing mental health technician



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- 1 certificate program by adding clinical skills and knowledge
- 2 necessary to perform higher job requirements in more advanced
- 3 clinical settings. The coursework can also be applied toward
- 4 baccalaureate degrees. These programs help to grow the State's
- 5 overall capacity to address the mental health challenges and
- 6 needs of Hawaii's residents.
- 7 The mental health technician certificate of competence
- 8 program consists of three approved courses, which provide a
- 9 basic foundation in mental health knowledge in a short term,
- 10 focused program of study available in person and online. The
- 11 asynchronous online courses can be offered to mental health
- 12 workers and students across the State, with Windward community
- 13 college coordinating with other community colleges in the
- 14 University of Hawaii system. However, in order for the program
- 15 to be offered statewide, additional resources are needed to
- 16 provide for key personnel and to establish a scholarship program
- 17 to increase access to the mental health technician certificate
- 18 of competence program for unemployed, underemployed, low-wage
- 19 earners, and others interested in pursuing a career pathway in
- 20 mental health.

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- 1 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
- 2 University of Hawaii to expand and support the mental health
- 3 technician certificate of competence program.
- 4 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$137,250 or so much
- 6 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 to support
- 7 and expand the mental health technician certificate of
- 8 competence program through the hiring of one full-time
- 9 equivalent (1.0 FTE) mental health technician certificate
- 10 program coordinator, establishment of a scholarship program and
- 11 granting of scholarships, and any other necessary administrative
- 12 costs.
- 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 14 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.

Description:

Appropriates funds to support and expand the mental health technician certificate of competence program through the hiring of a mental health technician certificate program coordinator, establishment of a scholarship program, and any other necessary administrative costs.

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
