## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RIGHT OF ENTRY FOR PROFESSIONAL SURVEYORS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that professional land 2 surveyors require reasonable access over and across certain real properties at reasonable times in the regular course of their 3 4 work to conduct a survey of common property boundaries that are used to determine the legal interests of parties in real 5 property. A professional land surveyor requires access to: 6 7 Retrace record boundary lines; (1)(2) Recover or reestablish boundary monuments or survey 9 controls; and 10 Locate rights-of-way or improvements with positional (3) 11 discrepancies. 12 Without a right of entry, a professional land surveyor 13 conducting a land survey is often subject to trespass laws, 14 prohibiting the land surveyor from conducting a land survey 15 required to ensure the public's interest in maintaining a sound and uniform real property system. 16

6	SECTION 2. Chapter 464, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
8	and to read as follows:
9	"§464- Professional land surveyor right of entry to
10	private property; notification; identification; liability. (a)
11	A professional land surveyor licensed pursuant to this chapter
12	and any assistant under the direct supervision of the land
13	surveyor may enter the private property of the landowner of the
14	real property to be surveyed and any adjoining lands at
15	reasonable times to perform land surveying at the request of the
16	landowner of, or person with an interest in, the real property
17	to be surveyed.
18	(b) The land surveyor shall give at least ten days written
19	notice of the intention to enter the private property on which
20	the land surveying is to be performed when the land surveying
21	may involve adjoining lands. The written notice shall include:

The purpose of this Act is to establish a right of entry

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1	(1)	The name of the fandowner of, of person with an

5	<u>(2)</u>	The date and time the survey work is proposed to be
6		performed; and
7	(3)	The name and contact information of the land surveyor
8		who will perform the work.
9	Written n	otice shall be sent to the last known address of the
10	landowner	of, or person with an interest in, the real property
11	to be sur	veyed and the landowner or occupier of adjoining lands
12	to be acc	essed. Notice sent by certified mail shall be deemed
13	sufficien	<u>t.</u>
14	When	the landowner of, or person with an interest in, the
15	real prop	erty to be surveyed, or the landowner or occupier of
16	adjoining	lands to be accessed, gives notice to the land
17	surveyor	that the surveying may disrupt or interfere with
18	operation	s on the properties involved, the land surveyor shall
19	meet with	the landowner, person with an interest, or occupier to
20	negotiate	a mutually agreeable date and time to perform the land
21	surveying	. <u></u>

1	(c) The land surveyor shall carry identification, which
2	shall include a valid government-issued photo identification
3	and:
4	(1) The certificate of licensure with the license number
5	issued pursuant to this chapter, or a facsimile
6	thereof; or
7	(2) A seal or stamp, or facsimile thereof, authorized
8	pursuant to section 464-11; and
9	a copy of the notice submitted pursuant to this section.
10	(d) The land surveyor and the land surveyor's assistants
11	shall not be liable for any incidental minor damage to property
12	as a result of land surveying, except for damages that result
13	from the land surveyor's or the land surveyor's assistants'
14	gross negligence or wanton acts or omissions. For purposes of
15	this subsection, damages shall be deemed to be minor if the
16	damages are less than \$100."
17	SECTION 3. Section 708-813, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18	amended by amending subsection (2) to read as follows:
19	"(2) Subsection (1) shall not apply to $[a]$ :
20	(a) $\underline{A}$ process server who enters or remains in or upon the
21	land or premises of another, unless the land or

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1	premises are secured with a fence and locked gate, for
2	the purpose of making a good faith attempt to perform
3	their legal duties and to serve process upon any of
4	the following:
5	[ <del>(a)</del> ] <u>(i)</u> An owner or occupant of the land or
6	premises;
7	[ <del>(b)</del> ] <u>(ii)</u> An agent of the owner or occupant of the
8	land or premises; or
9	[ <del>(c)</del> ] <u>(iii)</u> A lessee of the land or premises[+]; or
10	(b) A professional land surveyor, or assistant under the
11	direct supervision of the land surveyor, who enters or
12	remains in or upon the land or premises of another,
13	after giving notice as required by section 464- ,
14	for the purpose of performing land surveying at the
15	request of the landowner of, or person with an
16	interest in, the real property to be surveyed."
17	SECTION 4. Section 708-814, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18	amended by amending subsection (2) to read as follows:
19	"(2) Subsection (1) shall not apply to $[a]$ :
20	$\underline{\text{(a)}}$ $\underline{A}$ process server who enters or remains in or upon the
21	land or premises of another, unless the land or

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1	premises are secured with a fence and locked gate, for
2	the purpose of making a good faith attempt to perform
3	the process server's legal duties and to serve process
4	upon any of the following:
5	[ <del>(a)</del> ] <u>(i)</u> An owner or occupant of the land or
6	premises;
7	[ <del>(b)</del> ] <u>(ii)</u> An agent of the owner or occupant of the
8	land or premises; or
9	[ <del>(c)</del> ] <u>(iii)</u> A lessee of the land or premises.
10	For the purposes of this [subsection, paragraph,
11	"process server" means any person authorized under the
12	Hawaii rules of civil procedure, district court rules
13	of civil procedure, Hawaii family court rules, or
14	section 353C-10 to serve process[-]; or
15	(b) A professional land surveyor, or assistant under the
16	direct supervision of the land surveyor, who enters or
17	remains in or upon the land or premises of another,
18	after giving notice as required by section 464- ,
19	for the purpose of performing land surveying at the
20	request of the landowner of, or person with an
21	interest in, the real property to be surveyed."

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- 1 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

#### Report Title:

Land Surveyors; Assistants; Right of Entry; Private Property; Trespass

#### Description:

Authorizes professional land surveyors and assistants under the direct supervision of land surveyors to enter private property to perform land surveying, subject to certain provisions regarding notice, identification, and liability. Shields land surveyors and their assistants from prosecution under criminal trespass laws when performing their duties. (HD1)

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
