A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FOOD DONATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 145D-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended as follows:
- 3 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 4 and to read:
- 5 ""Wild game" means a non-domesticated species of animal,
- 6 the products of which are food, but does not include poultry,
- 7 poultry products, livestock, livestock products, seafood,
- 8 seafood products, or freshwater nongame fish. "Wild game"
- 9 includes deer."
- 10 2. By amending the definitions of "donor" and "food
- 11 product" to read:
- ""Donor" means any person, partnership, corporation,
- 13 company, or association engaged in the farming, processing,
- 14 distribution, wholesaling, or retailing of food products who
- 15 donates such products, without remuneration, to a charitable,
- 16 religious, or nonprofit organization. "Donor" includes any
- 17 person, partnership, corporation, company, or association who

1	donates with game, without remaneration, to a charitable,
2	religious, or nonprofit organization.
3	"Food product" means any fowl, seafood, animal, vegetable,
4	cr other stuff, product, or article which is customary food fit
5	for human consumption, including prepared, canned, milk, dairy,
6	and farm products, before or after the expiration date stamped
7	cn the products, if any. Food product includes wild game."
8	SECTION 2. Section 145D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended by amending subsections (d) and (e) to read as follows
10	"(d) The exceptions to liability specified in subsection
11	(a) shall include:
12	(1) The donation of perishable or nonperishable food that
13	has exceeded the labeled shelf life date recommended
14	by the manufacturer; [and]
15	(2) The donation of farm produce; provided that the good-
16	faith donor or distributor reasonably believes that
17	the food is fit for human consumption $[\cdot]$; and
18	(3) The donation of wild game; provided that the good-
19	faith donor or distributor reasonably believes that
20	the food is fit for human consumption.
21	(e) [For the purposes of] As used in this section:

- 1 "Donor" means any individual, food vendor, food
- 2 manufacturer, food distributor, grocery or convenience store,
- 3 charitable or nonprofit organization, or government agency that
- 4 donates wild game the entity reasonably believes is fit for
- 5 human consumption or food to needy persons where the food in
- 6 question, except wild game, has been prepared and packaged in a
- 7 facility meeting all relevant food safety guidelines,
- 8 certifications, and requirements and has passed all food safety
- 9 inspections."
- 10 "Farm produce" means all agricultural, horticultural, and
- 11 vegetable produce of the soil, but does not include poultry,
- 12 poultry products, livestock and livestock products, aquaculture
- 13 and aquaculture products, and timber or timber products."
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 15 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 16 begun before its effective date.
- 17 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 19 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
