## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that title I, part A, of
- 2 the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as amended
- 3 by the Every Student Succeeds Act (Title I), provides federal
- 4 financial assistance to local educational agencies and schools
- 5 with high percentages of children from low-income families to
- 6 help ensure educational success.
- 7 To assist in identifying methods of relieving the financial
- 8 burden of education on low-income families, Act 142, Session
- 9 Laws of Hawaii 2022, was enacted to establish a school supply
- 10 subsidy pilot program within the department of education to
- 11 subsidize school supplies at schools composed entirely of
- 12 students eligible for participation in Title I. The school
- 13 supply subsidy pilot program was established as a one-year pilot
- 14 program to be operated only for the 2022-2023 school year. The
- 15 legislature believes the value in the pilot program necessitates
- 16 the extension of the pilot program for two additional years.

- 1 The purpose of this Act is to extend the school supply
- 2 subsidy pilot program established pursuant to Act 142, Session
- 3 Laws of Hawaii 2022, for an additional two years.
- 4 SECTION 2. Act 142, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, is
- 5 amended as follows:
- 6 1. By amending section 2 to read:
- 7 "SECTION 2. (a) Beginning with the 2022-2023 school year,
- 8 the department of education shall establish and implement a
- 9 [one-year] three-year school supply subsidy pilot program at all
- 10 schools composed entirely of students eligible for participation
- 11 in Title I, Part A, of the Elementary and Secondary Education
- 12 Act, as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act[, including
- 13 but not limited to Naalehu elementary school].
- 14 (b) The department of education shall submit a report of
- 15 its findings and recommendations regarding the school supply
- 16 subsidy pilot program, including any proposed legislation, to
- 17 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
- 18 of the regular session of  $[\frac{2024}{}]$  2026."
- 19 2. By amending section 5 to read:
- "SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022,
- 21 and shall be repealed on January 1, [2024.] 2026."

- 1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
- 4 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 5 year 2024-2025 for the continuation of the school supply subsidy
- 6 pilot program within the department of education established
- 7 pursuant to Act 142, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, as extended by
- 8 section 2 of this Act.
- 9 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 10 of education for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 13 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
