A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that mental health
- 2 conditions are treated in various ways, depending on the
- 3 condition, and can include medication, therapy, and psychosocial
- 4 services. Congress, through the Breakthrough Therapies Act, and
- 5 the Food and Drug Administration have indicated that
- 6 methylenedioxymethamphetamine, commonly known as MDMA, and
- 7 psilocybin will be rescheduled to enable therapeutic use. MDMA
- 8 and psilocybin have already been granted the Food and Drug
- 9 Administration's breakthrough therapy designation to fast-track
- 10 research and potential approval given efficacy in treating
- 11 treatment-resistant depression and post-traumatic stress
- 12 disorder. These treatments, while effective for certain
- 13 conditions and patients, do not treat all mental health
- 14 conditions. However, research supports the effectiveness of
- 15 natural and alternative medicines and therapies, such as the use
- 16 of MDMA, psilocybin, and other therapies, as a safe and
- 17 effective way to potentially treat depression, post-traumatic

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stress disorder, addiction, end-of-life psychological distress, 2 and other afflictions. 3 The purpose of this Act is to establish the beneficial treatments advisory council to review, evaluate, and recommend 4 5 new medicinal treatments for mental health. 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately 8 designated and to read as follows: 9 "§321- Beneficial treatments advisory council; 10 established. (a) There is established within the department 11 for administrative purposes only, a beneficial treatments 12 advisory council. The council shall consist of the following 13 members: 14 (1) Five of the members, or their respective designees, 15 shall be the following ex officio, voting members: 16 The director of health, who shall serve as the (A) 17 chairperson of the advisory council; 18 (B) The attorney general; 19 The chairpersons of the health standing (C) 20 committees within the senate and house of 21 representatives; and

1		<u>(D)</u>	The chairperson of the Hawaii state council on
2			mental health; and
3	(2)	Four	of the members shall be appointed pursuant to
4		sect	ion 26-34 and shall consist of:
5		(A)	A physician who is duly licensed pursuant to
6			chapter 453 or an advanced practice registered
7			nurse who is authorized to prescribe psychotropic
8			medication and is duly licensed pursuant to
9			<pre>chapter 457;</pre>
10		(B)	One physician duly licensed pursuant to
11			chapter 453, with specialties in substance abuse
12			and psychiatry;
13		<u>(C)</u>	One representative from an organization that
14			advocates for the therapeutic use of plant-based
15			<pre>psychedelic modalities; and</pre>
16		(D)	One representative from an accredited research
17			institution providing cortication and train for
18			professionals on the use of psychedelic
19			modalities.
20	(b)	Memb	ers appointed pursuant to subsection (a)(2) shall
21	serve wit	hout	compensation, but may be reimbursed for necessary

1	expenses,	including reasonable travel expenses, incurred in the
2	performan	ce of their duties.
3	<u>(c)</u>	The beneficial treatments advisory council shall:
4	(1)	Examine federal, state, and local laws, regulations,
5		administrative rules, and procedures regarding the
6		treatment of mental health;
7	(2)	Examine available medical, psychological, and
8		scientific studies, research, and other information
9		relating to the safety and efficacy of methods to
10		treat mental health conditions;
11	<u>(3)</u>	Examine requirements, specifications, and guidelines
12		for a medical professional to prescribe and provide
13		various treatments to patients in jurisdictions in
14		which the treatment is used to treat mental health
15		conditions;
16	(4)	Develop a long-term strategic plan to ensure the
17		availability of therapeutic psilocybin,
18		psilocybin-based products, and
19		methylenedioxymethamphetamine that are safe,
20		accessible, and affordable for adults twenty-one years
21		of age or older; and

1 (5) Advise the department on new and revised mental health
2 treatment options."
3 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
